Introduction

F or Cochin Shipyard Limited, CSR is the way through which we achieve a balance of economic, environmental and social imperatives (Triple-Bottom-Line), while at the same time addressing the expectations of shareholders and stakeholders.

CSL, in consonance with its corporate vision looks forward to continuing in the best tradition of being a responsible corporate citizen recognized for the quality of the products and services and respected for its ethical way of conducting business. For us CSR is not merely performative but a genuine attempt to do good and we consider it good to incorporate these values and concerns appreciating the sentiments of our stakeholders spread across the whole world.

CSL CSR has travelled a long way from the days where CSR was considered to be a philanthropic act to a stage where CSR is woven to the corporate strategy of the Company, aligning it with the Sustainable Development Goals of the UN paving way to the ESG reporting standards.

The Company has been discharging its Corporate Social Responsibility with innovative ideas and management skills with greater efficiency and better outcomes, as envisaged by the architects of the scheme.

The Corporate Social Responsibility in the Company is Board driven. CSL has put in place an effective CSR Policy and Plan implementation machinery. The CSR policy of the Company was adopted by the Board in its 213th meeting held on 16 Sep 2014 encompassing the basic tenets of Schedule VII of the Companies Act 2013 and the UN Sustainable Development Goals. This was amended in its 260th meeting held on 11 June 2021 incorporating the amendments proposed subsequently by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs and Department of Public Enterprises, Government of India.

Each year, Annual Action Plan are drawn including the activities and projects to be undertaken during the year. These details are also displayed in the Company website. The Annual Action Plan is guided by the Policy and the Central themes decided in line with the national priorities, decided by the Government of India.

The Cell is responsible for maintaining records of all project proposals, execution of the projects, conducting periodic Executive Committee meetings and CSR reporting.

CSL CSR cell receives proposals for CSR support from project implementing agencies, beneficiaries and the government. Each proposal received by CSL is further examined and scrutinized after in-situ visits and need assessment, wherever necessary by the ExecutiveCommittee before these are recommended to the CSR committee of the Board. The selection of projects is undertaken in such a way so as to create a larger multiplier effect in the society. CSR Board Level Committee after due analysis and evaluation recommends



those identified projects for approval by the Board. The Board being the ultimate body accords approval for those projects duly deliberated and identified by it.

The project proposals are invited throughout the year from the qualified implementing/ executing agencies to undertake the CSR projects. The projects are undertaken by the implementing agencies, under supervision and guidance by CSL CSR team as per schedule, guided by a signed contractual agreement between the Implementing Agency and Company. Projects under progress as well as completed projects are regularly monitored and evaluated by CSL CSR Team. Periodic review reports of the same are presented to the CSR Committee of the Board and subsequently to the Board. Impact Assessment is also undertaken for selected high value projects by engaging professional management institutions.

The projects are spread across the most common fields of CSR interventions appearing in Schedule VII of the Companies Act 2013. However, the major focus areas of CSL CSR continued to be health, education, nutrition, capacity building, environmental protection, sanitation and drinking water for the economically poor and weaker sections of the society including the differently-abled, senior citizens etc. Through a series of CSR interventions focused on the above said areas, Cochin Shipyard could impact the communities who are our most important stake holders. The Company has earned a reputation in the societydue to its CSR interventions.

MAJOR & MINOR PROJECTS

Minor Projects: C&MD can approve projects that are relatively urgent in nature which are worth Rs.10 lakhs or below, limited to 10% of the overall CSR budget of the Company. Such projects are treated as minor projects for administrative convenience. A list of such projects is presented to the Board subsequently for information.

Major Projects: All other projects are treated as major projects.

PROJECTS APPROVED FOR THE YEAR 2021-22- MAJOR AND MINOR

During the course of the year, the Board has approved 36 projects under major category worth Rs.1203.34 lakhs and 25 Nos of projects under minor category. The CSR for the year consisted of projects approved by the Board during the year and also projects carried forward from previous years.

THEME FOR 2021-22

The Government of India adopts theme-based approach each year in a focused manner in consonance with the national priorities.

As advised by the Department of Public Enterprises, Govt. of India, vide OM dated 12th May 2021, "Health & Nutrition, with special focus on COVID related measures including setting up makeshift hospitals and temporary covid care facilities" has been adopted as common theme for undertaking CSR activities for the year 2021-22. Priority was extended to aspirational district – Wayanad, the sole aspirational district having substantial tribal population, in Kerala.

The district of Wayanad is the sole aspiration district in Kerala and the Company has been associating with the District Administration for the CSR activities in that district. The Nodal Officer, the Head CSR of the Company attends meeting held by the Central Prabhari Adhikari and actively participates in the developmental initiatives of the district.

For the current year, the Company has committed following 10 projects in Wayanad district with a total budget of Rs.284.00 lakhs. The Company has disbursed an amount of Rs.81.49 lakhs during the year.

NOTABLE PROJECTS UNDERTAKEN DURING THE YEAR

FIGHT AGAINST CORONA

The Company continued its commitment towards fighting spread of Covid pandemic. The efforts undertaken by the Company were multipronged including direct intervention, infrastructure development in the hospitals, fighting poverty caused due to lack of jobs and creating awareness.

VACCINATION

Vaccination of all employees, their family members, the local community around its region had been a huge challenge for the Company. The Company took quick initiatives to vaccinate all the employees, their family members, contractors, their family members and the community around it in a time bound manner, so as to bring back the shipyard to normalcy.

In this process the Company has spent Rs.213 lakhs, of which Rs.148.64 lahks only has been claimed to be from the CSR as the balance money is relating to vaccinating its employees and their family members.

The vaccination was undertaken through the designated Covid Vaccination Centres (CVC) for the employees and the community in the vicinity.



Free vaccination was provided to the general public through hospitals in the district, identified by the District Administration.



INFRASTRUCTURE TO FIGHT SPREAD OF COVID CORONA

Centralised Oxygen Distribution Facility at five Government Hospitals. The Company set up Centralised Oxygen Distribution facilities at five Government Hospitals in the region. The system facilitates direct delivery of pressurized oxygen through wall mounted outlets close to the patient's bed.

Medical Oxygen is critical in Covid-19 treatment. Most of the hospitals were facing a sudden spurt in demand for piped oxygen supply forcing hospital administrations to make arrangements by which Oxygen from cylinders connected to a cylinder bank located in the hospital basement or suitable place is piped to the patient's bed through copper piping.



National Health Mission executed the project on behalf of CSL in the Govt. Taluk Hospitals at Fort Kochi, Palluruthy and Thripunithura, District Hospital Aluva and the General Hospital, Muvattupuzha. This has been a great help in combating the Covid cases amidst the alarming spread of the pandemic across the country.

SETTING UP COVID CARE WARDS IN THE HOSPITALS

During the peak time of the spread of pandemic and hospitals were struggling to accommodate mounting number of patients, the Company helped setting up of covid care wards with additional facilities and equipment in the hospitals in the vicinity. This has provided relief to many who were struggling to get admission to the hospital during the difficult period.

VACCINE DELIVERY VEHICLE TO THE ASPIRATIONAL DISTRICT

Vaccination of large number of people was a challenge in the aspirational district, Wayanad, with whom CSL has been associated with as the district has a large number of tribal population living in remote hamlets, most of them within the jungles.

Reaching out to the community is the only way to tackle this issue. In association with the district administration, a full-fledged vaccine delivery vehicle with sufficient storage capacity with all equipment and the medical and paramedical staff was procured engaged for vaccination.



Cochin Shipyard also rose to the occasion while the community around them were suffering from poverty and malnutrition due to the spread of covid corona. CSL provided food kits to the community who are economically weaker and also supported the community kitchen run by the Municipal Corporation.

HEALTH CARE PROJECTS

CAPACITY BUILDING IN THE HOSPITALS

The Company set up a state of the art surgical oncology centre in a cooperative sector hospital in the city. This hospital has been providing the services of the best doctors in the oncology and cancer care. This is also a designated centre for the Cochin Cancer Centre to undertake surgical interventions for the cancer patients.



Company has been supporting facilities like pathology lab and other additional facilities wherever unavailable for better diagnosis for the primary health care centres across the region.

MEDICAL VANS AND AMBULANCES

The Company has contributed a substantial fund towards procurement and operation of medical vans and ambulances to hospitals, social service organisations, old age homes, palliative care centres, etc.

GERIATRIC SPECIAL CARE HOME

CSL has been supporting the agencies who have been running homes for the geriatric, abandoned, palliative care and special care homes etc as part of its CSR.





These homes are doing yeoman services by running such centres for the community.

Jeramiah's Home Bertoni Palliative Care Centre, Ochanthuruth provides free accommodation and medical care to the female destitute discharged from isolation ward of General Hospital Ernakulam.

PALLIATIVE CARE CENTRE FOR CANCER PATIENTS

Guardian Angel Peace Mission is a hospice and palliative care centre providing quality care to the in mates. It mainly take care of terminally sick cancer patients- both as inpatients and also by way of home care services and also provide services to their bystanders including food on free of charges. CSL supported them to expand their current infrastructure and thereby accommodate 30 more patients with quality accommodation.



THEME-NUTRITION

The Company has helped set up state of the art four model Anganwadis across the aspirational district of Wayanad. The series of Anganwadis are named 'Thalir' which means new sprout.



The project got completed during the year and these are dedicated for the benefit of pupil during the year.

Strengthening of Anganwadis has helped to address the issue of malnutrition among the infants and the pregnant and lactating mothers.

The Company has helped strengthening 25 Anganwadis in the North Eastern State of Arunachal Pradesh during the year.





ASPIRATIONAL DISTRICT – WAYANAD

As per the guidelines issued by the Government of India, each Central Government PSU is required to support the aspirational districts as classified by the Niti Ayog, New Delhi according to the status of each district as per the Human Development Index.





The district Wayanad, the sole aspirational district in Kerala, which has a predominant tribal community population is the one adopted by the Company. The Head CSR and the Nodal Officer for aspirational district works in close liaison with the district administration.

The Company has worked on 10 projects in the aspirational district Wayanad and spent an amount of Rs.95 lakhs. Over a period of past three years, the Company has spent more than 300 lakhs in the aspirational district as below:

PROJECTS OUTSIDE THE STATE OF KERALA

The Company has not limited itself to its local area for CSR operations. It has undertaken projects from Kanyakumari in the south to Kashmir in the East, Arunachal Pradesh in the East to Jamnagar in the West.

The Company as a principle earmarks on projects limited to 20% of the CSR projects outside the state of Kerala.

Here, the Company prioritises on the projects which are innovative, impactful and relevant to the region.

To name a few- Construction of a Boat at Kanyakumari, weed harvesting machine at Dal Lake, Kashmir, Addressed drinking water issues by providing water ATM at Nagaland and worked with the Navy to restore a degraded environment and created a park at Jamnagar.

JIJAUSHRUSHTI, SINDKHED RAJA, MAHARASHTRA

Sindkhed Raja is a backward region in the state of Maharashtra, in the district Buldana, near Aurangabad. The community in the district are economically and weak and deprived of quality healthcare.

This place is famous for the birth place of Jijamatha, mother of the emperor Shivaji the great. JijauShrushti, the NGO operating in the region came forward with the idea of setting up of a multi speciality health care centre, which has now become ready to be dedicated for service.

The medical van, with the basic amenities provided along with the project operates within the region, visits remote villages and offer services of the doctor.

ENGAGEMENT IN NORTH EASTERN STATES HAVING INTERNATIONAL BORDERS

The Noklak District is a recently formed district in Nagaland having a very long borderline with Myanmar. The majority population is the district is economically weak. The lack of safe drinking water is a causing serious health issues to the community, as per the available details with the state.

The Company has helped setting up a water treatment plant of 5000 litres per hour capacity, which will be used as a water ATM to supply water at subsidised rate.

Similarly, another district, Changlang, at Arunachal Pradesh, the land of rising sun, had a problem with reference to connecting the Anganwadi system with the education system. 50 Anganwadis were renovated by the District administration of which CSL supported 25 Anganwadis to improve the facilities in line with the New Education Policy of the Government of India.





OTHER NOTABLE PROJECTS

EMPOWERMENT

CSL believes that empowerment of people by providing equal opportunity without any gender bias, caste or creed and eradication of inequality among the deprived communities.

The CSR interventions included livelihood enhancement, community development, women empowerment etc.

REFRIGERATED MOBILE FISH VENDING KIOSKS

In order to promote the living standards of women fish vendors, CSL entered into a collaborative project with ICAR-CIFT for distribution of Refrigerated Mobile Fish Vending Kiosks to selected the beneficiaries from fishermen community in Kerala.

'Refrigerated Mobile Fish Vending Kiosk' is developed for selling of fish in the closed chilled chamber under hygienic conditions. Fishermen, fish processors and traders can rely on this simple cost-effective equipment to meet the required food hygiene and safety standards in fish handling. The developed kiosk is ergonomically designed for women fish vendors. Cochin Shipyard Limited approved this project to be undertaken under its CSR programme to selected beneficiaries from fishermen community. The beneficiaries are identified by the Society for Assistance to Fisherwomen (SAF)-an Agency under Fisheries Department, Government of Kerala. A total number of 26 machines at a total cost of Rs.17.00 lakhs are supported by CSL CSR programme. The total cost per machine works out to around Rs.80,000/- of which the CSL's support works out to about 90 percent and balance as the beneficiary contribution.



SABARI SARANASHRAMAM

The forest around Sabarimala, the abode of Lord Ayyappa is known as Poonakavanam with dense vegetation and small streams and thus known as holy forest.

There are 15 tribal colonies, with 350 tribal families with a total population of more than 3500.





CSL joined hands with Sabari Saranashramam to create "Manikanda Gurukulam" to rehabilitate the whole kids to provide primary facilities, food, healthcare, education, empowering women and protection of wild life. Manikanda Gurukulam is equipped with primary but modern facilities.

MAGIC OF DARKNESS

Universal Empowerment Centre under the Academy of Magical Sciences, Trivandrum run by renowned magician Gopinath Muthukad has set up a centre for visually challenged persons named magic of darkness.

The centre provides skill training and improves the employability of visually challenged persons to perform on a stage.

The centre provides opportunity for differently abled persons from any part of the world to train themselves and perform in their theatres.

SRI RAMAKRISHNA REHABILITATION CENTRE

The Sri Ramakrishna Rehabilitation Centre at Kaloor, Ernakulam is a home providing services to the destitute. The centre provides quality accommodation, life skill training including support to transgenders.

CSL supported this centre to improve their facilities to conduct training sessions and also to provide medical services to the inmates and OP facility to the public.





EDUCATION

The gap between the government and government-aided schools and the private sector school is narrowing down, thanks to the intervention by the governments. Still there exists disparity in the quality of education. The reason includes lack of infrastructure, dropouts due to poverty, unemployment and other social barriers.

The other contributing factors are poverty, unemployment and discrimination based on caste, gender, race, and other social barriers. The education system in underprivileged areas is consistently underfunded.



This leads to a wide range of problems, from increased class sizes and lowered standards too low graduation rates and high failure rates.

CSL has been consistent in its policy that investment in the education sector is paramount. CSL has initiates various programs to address the problems faced by the sector in this region in general and the aspirational district and other backward districts in particular.



Though the primary education sector in Kerala is considered to be very good compared to many other states, may need to be done in regions which are tribal, remote and coastal, in particular.

CSL has initiated a series of programs to address these issues qualitatively and quantitively. Creating infrastructure in the form of additional class rooms, smart class rooms, quality toilets for both girls and boys, conducting specific programs in the form of additional class room training, sports activities, sports infrastructure in schools, school libraries, facilities for improved menstrual hygiene etc, to address the issue of school drop outs.



ENVIRONMENT

Harithagiri – a project for promotion of kitchen garden for green future in Girinagar Residents Association, Ernakulam.

The home gardens in Kerala evolved in response to the pressure of a shrinking land resource base coupled with high population density. Terrace farming or roof top vegetable gardening is mainly practiced in urban areas where people have very little land for cultivation.



The project is aimed at creating awareness about the need of organic terrace gardening and urban farming in Girinagar residential area of Kochi Corporation by cultivating their own organic vegetable gardens at their roof tops and by recycling the waste from one's home.

CONVERSION OF USED COPPER SLAG, A FINAL WASTE BYE-PRODUCT INTO USEFUL PRODUCTS.

Cochin Shipyard uses copper slag for Shot-Blasting of paint and rust from ship body. Shot-Blasting is a process, in which the surface of metal body is sprayed at high blast pressure, with hard particles. After repeated use of this slag, for blasting, the size of the particle reduces to small particle and has to be discarded. High volume of discarded slag poses number of problems like soil degradation as these contain substantial polymer paint particles, rust, dust, etc. Since traces of elements like Lead, Chromium, Arsenic, Antimony, paint particles, etc are present, this used copper slag cannot be used for landfilling. It cannot be left in open due to dust pollution.

Hence, the urgent need to convert this used copper slag to some useful products which are cost effective and economically viable and marketable that will serve the purpose of disposal as well as protect environment

CSL in association with the Makers Village a startup initiative of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India initiated product development with the used copper slag as a startup initiative under its CSR programme. M/s Vishnam Engineers associated with Makers Village, to initiate this start-up project.

Experiments were held on converting used copper slag into marketable products and as a result the product of paver blocks was developed with cost effective method. These are found to be technically feasible and economically viable meeting all technical standards





PARKS AND OPEN AIR GYMS



Open air gyms have been the hallmark of the developed cities. The public places and parks can accommodate open air gyms to encourage people to do workouts. These micro open air gyms are becoming trendy and attracts lot of youngsters, women and the old alike.



CSL has been associating with the LSGs to improve the public parks, which are considered to be lungs of the concrete cities.



CULTURE

Our country has a huge cultural heritage. Cochin shipyard believes the welfare of society and country includes national heritage conservation. It is also a kind of service to the society and its cultural, economic and social development. Hence the CSR fund could be a pathbreaking tool to finance heritage conservation projects.

Understanding well the spirit behind this, CSL has been contributing towards promotion of towards promotion of arts and culture, heritage etc.

CREATING OF GRAFFITI – STREET WALL ART IN DIFFERENT PARTS OF VYPIN ISLAND.

Cochin Shipyard, in association with the District Tourism Promotion Council, created 75 Grafitties with the help of renowned artists in the locality as part of the Festival of the 75th year of independence of India. These graffities are painted on the public walls in the coastal highway of Ernakulam.



PAZHASSI LIBRARY

The Company supported this library, originally initiated with public participation which has been functioning at a town called Mananthawadi in the aspirational district, Wayanad.

The Library is named after the famous freedom fighter Pazhassi Raja, who fought the British and martyred in a battle with the British East India Company in this town.





The library has been a center for the youth and the educated to assemble and exchange ideas on issues on environment, developmental and cultural issues connected with the tribal and SC communities. This library also acts as a skill development center for the community in the locality.

RECONSTRUCTION OF LIBRARY

Sri Ramakrishna Adwaita Ashrama, Moovattupuzha had a stand alone library building outside its premises catering to the general public. This building was in a dilapidated condition and out of service.

The ashram approached CSR support from CSL and CSL obliged by providing them fund to renovate with furniture and modern facilities aligning it with the current world of knowledge and information technology.





ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE PAST 10 YEARS

Since inception as on date, CSL has undertaken more than 600 projects and spent more than 100 crores in CSR.

In the year 2014-15, from the time when 2% spending was mandate by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, the Company has never failed in achieving the target. Instead, the Company has always been spending in excess of the mandated spend of 2%.

Since 2010-11, Cochin Shipyard has spent the following expenditure on CSR as given below. It may be noted that there was no mandatory requirement of spending under the MCA rules prior to 2014-15.
