Introduction

Cochin Shipyard Limited is a listed company under the administrative ministry of Ports Shipping and Waterways, Government of India. The company holds the status of Category 1 Miniratna company, awarded by the Government.

Corporate Social Responsibility has become an integral part of the business philosophy of Cochin Shipyard Limited and has been started getting identified for its CSR activities in the public.

Over the past 50 years of its existence, CSL has established itself as a responsible corporate citizen having concern over the society and environment around it. CSR has been a way through which we achieved a balance of economic, environmental and social imperatives (Triple-Bottom-Line), while at the same time addressing the expectations of shareholders and stakeholders.

We have travelled a long way from the days where CSR was considered to be a philanthropic act to a stage where CSR is woven to the corporate strategy of the company, aligning it with the Sustainable Development Goals of the UN paving way to the ESG reporting standards.

CSL, in consonance with its corporate vision looks forward to continuing in the best tradition of being a responsible corporate citizen recognized for the quality of the products and services and respected for its ethical way of conducting business.

For us CSR is not merely performative but a genuine attempt to do good and we consider

it good to incorporate these values and concerns appreciating the sentiments of our stakeholders spread across the whole world.

The Company has been discharging its Corporate Social Responsibility with innovative ideas and management skills with greater efficiency and better outcomes, as envisaged by the architects of the scheme.

CSR in the company is Board driven. CSL has put in place an effective CSR implementation machinery. The CSR policy of the Company was adopted by the Board in its 213th meeting held on 16 Sep 2014 encompassing the basic tenets of Schedule VII of the Companies Act and the UN Sustainable Development Goals. This was amended in its 260th meeting held on 11 June 2021 incorporating the amendments proposed subsequently by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs and Department of Public Enterprises, Government of India.

Each year Annual Action Plans are drawn including the activities and projects to be undertaken during the year. These details are also displayed in the company website. The Annual Action Plan is guided by the Policy and the Central themes decided in line with the national priorities, decided by the Government of India.

The Cell is responsible for maintaining records of all project proposals, execution of the projects, conducting periodic Executive Committee meetings and reporting.

CSL CSR cell receives proposals for CSR support from project implementing agencies, beneficiaries and the government. Each proposal received by CSL is further examined and scrutinized after in-situ visits and need assessment, wherever necessary by the Executive Committee before these are recommended to the CSR committee of the Board. The selection of projects is undertaken in such a way so as to create a larger multiplier effect in the society. CSR Board Level Committee after due analysis and evaluation recommends those identified projects for approval by the Board. The Board being the ultimate body accords approval for those projects duly deliberated and identified by it.

The project proposals are invited throughout the year from the qualified implementing/executing agencies to undertake the CSR projects. The projects are undertaken by the implementing agencies, under supervision and guidance by CSL CSR team as per schedule, guided by a signed contractual agreement between the Implementing Agency and Company. Projects under progress as well as completed projects are regularly monitored and evaluated by CSL CSR Team. Periodic review reports of the same are presented to the CSR Committee of the Board and subsequently to the Board. Impact Assessment is also undertaken for selected high value projects by engaging professional management institutions.

The projects are spread across the most common fields of CSR interventions appearing in Schedule VII of Companies Act 2013. However, the major focus areas of CSL CSR continued to be health, education, nutrition, capacity building, environmental protection, sanitation and drinking water for the economically poor and weaker sections of the society including the differently-abled, senior citizens etc. Through a series of CSR interventions focused on the above said areas, Cochin Shipyard could impact the communities who are our most important stake holders. The company has earned a reputation in the society- due to its CSR interventions.

MAJOR & MINOR PROJECTS

Minor Projects: C&MD can approve projects that are relatively urgent in nature which are worth Rs.10 lakhs or below, limited to 10% of the overall CSR budget of the company. Such projects are treated as minor projects for administrative convenience. A list of such projects is presented to the Board for information at the end of the year.

Major Projects: All other projects are treated as major projects.

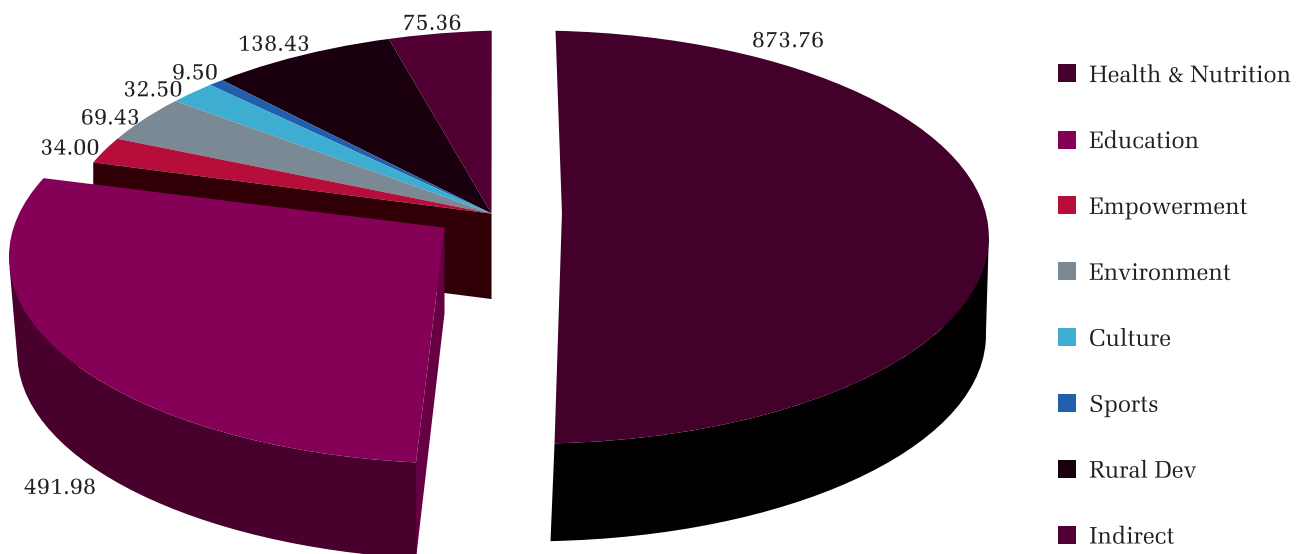

THEME FOR 2022-23

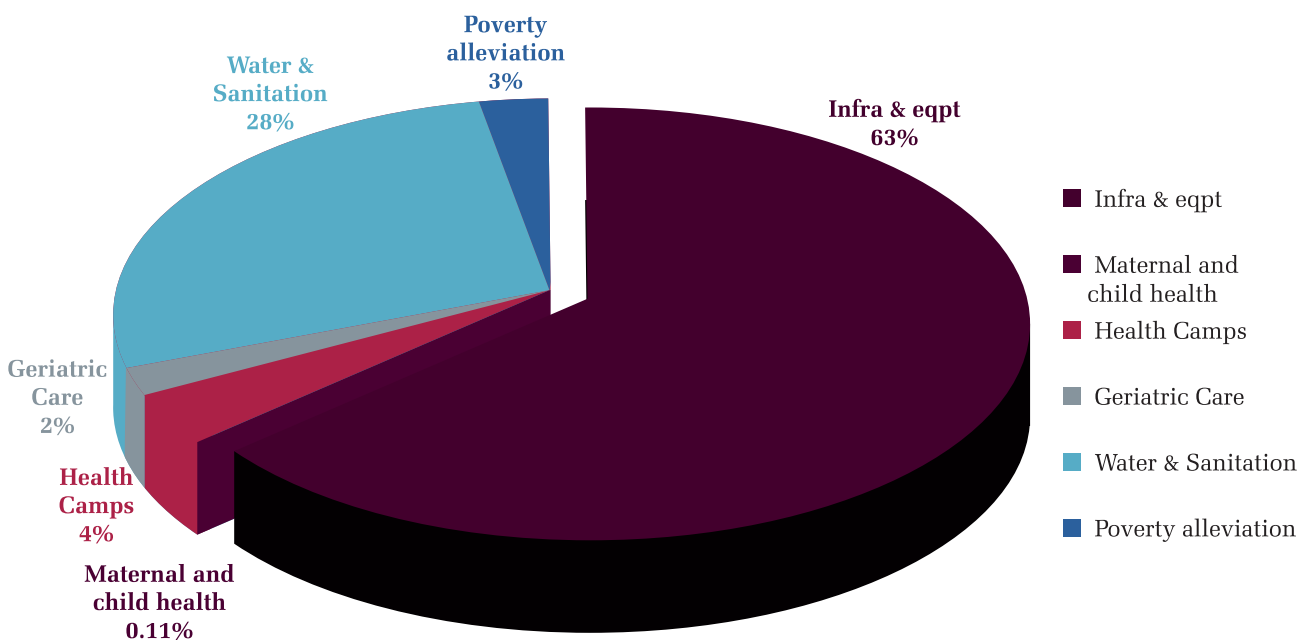
The Government of India adopts theme-based approach each year in a focussed manner in consonance with the National priorities.

As advised by the DPE, vide OM dated 05 April 2022, Health and Nutrition has been adopted as common theme for undertaking CSR activities for the year 2022-23. Priority was extended to aspirational district – Wayanad, the sole aspirational district having substantial tribal population, in Kerala.

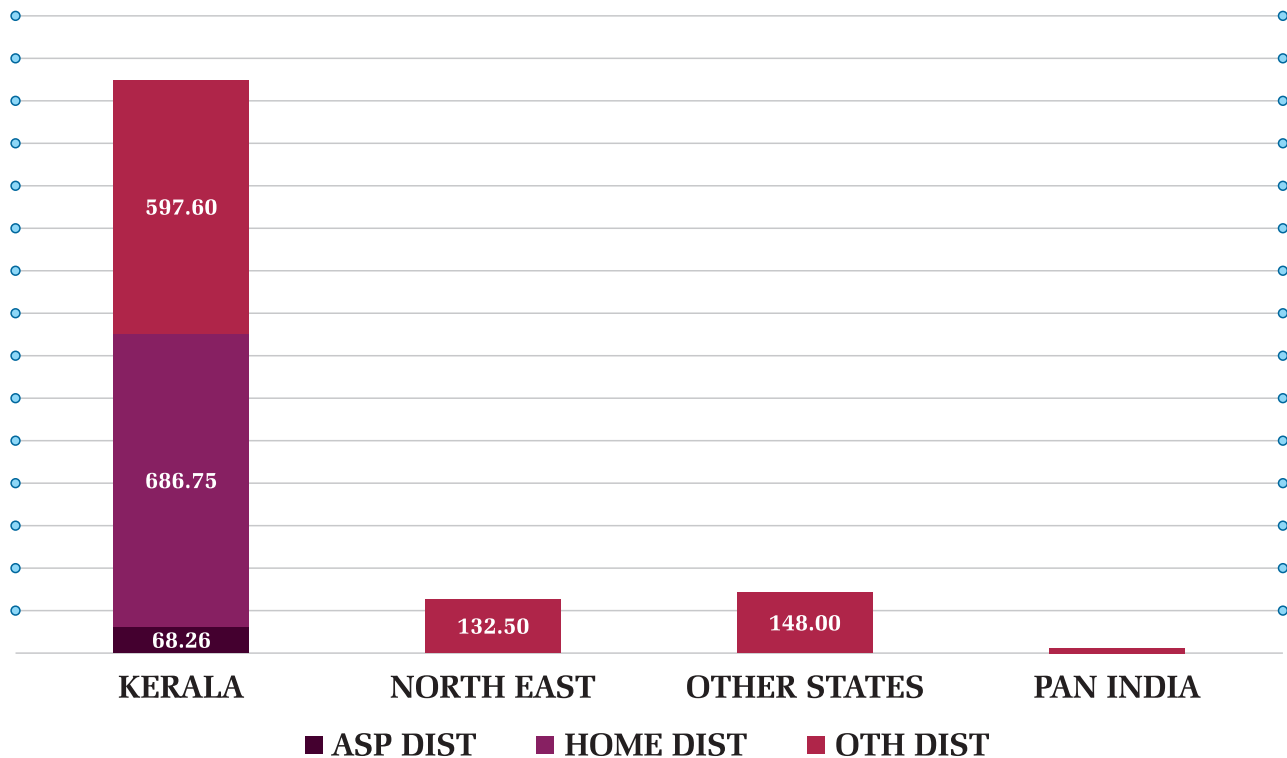

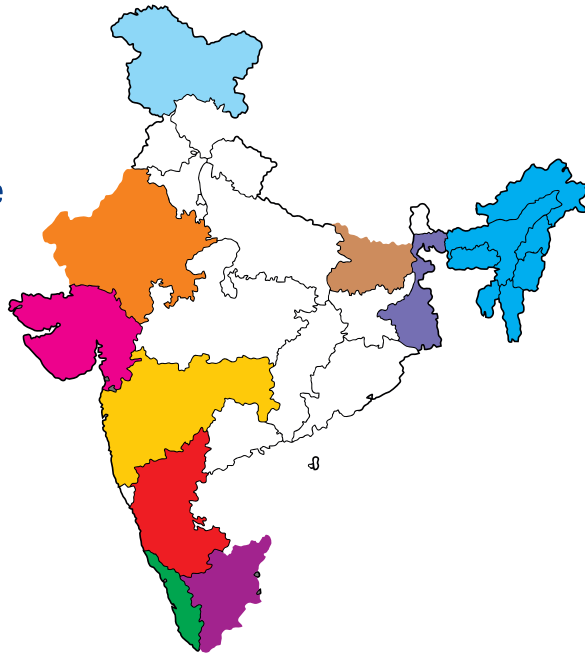

EXPENDITURE REGION WISE Rs. in Lakhs

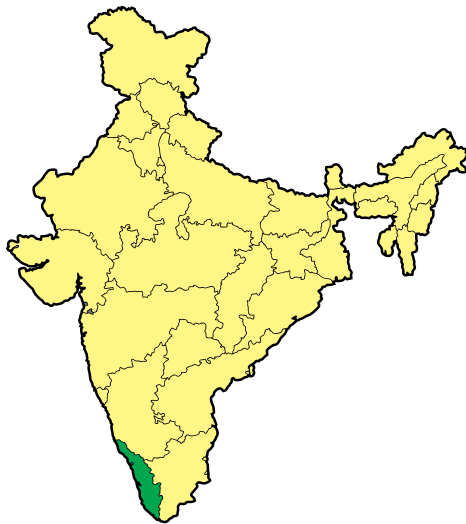

IMPACT ASSESSMENT

As per the revised CSR rules of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Impact assessment of completed individual projects valuing more than 1.00 crores for companies having an Annual CSR budget of Rs.10 Crores is mandatory. In compliance of the above rule, impact assessment of project Anantha Kripa executed by the company in the year

Anantha Kripa, Thiruvananthapuram



Ananthakripa is a CSR initiative of Cochin Shipyard Ltd which started functioning in the year 2018. Under this project, 12,000 square feet building with dormitories and rooms along with a kitchen and other amenities was set up to provide free accommodation facilities to patients and their bystanders who visit Thiruvananthapuram for tertiary medical care in the various medical care establishments in the city. An impact assessment study was carried out with the objective of evaluating the social relevance of the initiative and the effectiveness of the project in meeting the real needs of the targeted beneficiary group. The study followed a mixed-method research design combining the elements of qualitative and quantitative research approaches. A modified version of the OECD-DAC (Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)- Development Assistance Committee) framework for the evaluation of developmental and humanitarian projects was applied by which the project was assessed in terms of the criteria *relevance, effectiveness, impact, and sustainability*.





The study reveals that Ananthakripa scores well on all the evaluation criteria. Qualitative data analysis clearly indicates the social relevance of this project to the target beneficiary group. Free accommodation service for people who come to Thiruvananthapuram from different parts of Kerala for medical care and their bystanders helps enhance the larger ecosystem of affordable tertiary healthcare care in the entire state by improving the accessibility of quality medical care to the lower economic strata of the society. Facilities such as this address the hidden private costs of medical treatment especially in post-treatment care. Although government hospitals cover most of the costs of treatment, patients and their families still encounter several additional financial barriers, especially on money for food and accommodation. The indirect costs of income loss of family members supporting the patient are also a serious issue for most families. Therefore, free/subsidised accommodation services for patients and bystanders are enablers of the accessibility of medical care services for the financially disadvantaged sections of society. From the beneficiary survey, beneficiary satisfaction was found to be high with beneficiaries rating all dimensions of services related to Ananthakripa above 4.5 on a scale of 1 to 5. The level of advocacy was also seen to be very high, further validating the level of satisfaction of the beneficiaries. The survey also shows that the benefits of the project are reaching the right target audience. Most beneficiaries who avail of the facility are from economically backward sections (daily wage workers – 85%) having an annual income of less than Rs.1 lakh. Most respondents (226 out of 229) reported no specific problem or issue with any dimension of service during their stay in Ananthakripa. Therefore, it can be concluded that the project implementation has been effective and impactful. The sustainability dimension of the project also looks promising as the utilization of the facility is high owing to the high demand for the services and the wide volunteer base of the implementation agency ensures that the manpower requirements and the operating expenses of the facility are covered by volunteers and donations. In conclusion, Ananthakripa by contributing to the larger ecosystem of affordable healthcare to the masses is socially relevant and aligned with the company’s CSR mission of inclusive growth. The project is also consistent with the Sustainable Development Goals of accessible and inclusive health care.

“HYDRATION HUB” Water ATM at Cochin Fisheries Harbour, Thoppumpady

Cochin Fisheries Harbour hails more than 2000 people who pay huge money for mineral water and others who depend on unprocessed and contaminated water for consumption and also to carry to the outer sea in their fishing boats.

Many a times, the empty water bottles are disposed in the sea itself that damages the ecosystem and affects fisheries wealth. The cure to this was countered by Cochin Shipyard Limited, by installing a water purification system which provided safe drinking water, in the form of a water vending ATM at a nominal cost.



This has proven to be effective for both the people and the environment, as the fishermen and harbour workers can access safe drinking water at a very reasonable rate, while at the same time it will also decrease the waste disposal of plastic bottles into the sea. The user-friendly interface of the water ATM empowers the community with a reliable and convenient source of hydration.



“FROM STRUGGLE TO SPOTLIGHT” Transgender Dance Academy, Ernakulam

The Transgender Dance Academy is not just about dance: it is about breaking barriers and a celebration of individuality. Sri Sathya Sai Orphanage Trust is the largest NGO in Kerala that has been serving the community since 1996. They believe that the dance academy for transgenders can transform lives and nobody must be deprived of their rights to learn.

Cochin Shipyard Limited has played a pivotal role in providing financial assistance for the Transgender Dance Academy. It is in line with the company’s culture and vision that aims to extend support to all genders and promote the notions of equity and equality. Cochin Shipyard Limited takes in account the rights of transgenders who have been vulnerable and marginalized since generations.



Cochin Shipyard Limited has collaborated with Sri Sathya Sai orphanage Trust to provide specialized coaching and mentorship programs under renowned expertise for transgender dancers. This support not only contributes to the development of artistic excellence but also empowers the transgender community, promoting their social acceptance and recognition of talents.



“A BEACON OF CARE” Pioneers Medical Centre Construction at CUSAT

Primary health care is a critical component of health that focuses on delivering essential and accessible services to individuals and communities. COVID pandemic has created an uncertainty and raised questions upon the health of people. CUSAT has identified a major dilemma due to lack of infrastructure within their campus that deals with health conditions and emergencies. In the pursuit of a healthier tomorrow, Cochin Shipyard Limited has undertaken a profound endeavour by the construction of a new medical centre within the campus.



The major objective of the project is to establish facility to cater the primary health care needs of the CUSAT fraternity in particular and the community in the vicinity. This venture by Cochin Shipyard Limited not only signifies their prowess in craftsmanship but also their social responsibility and the profound impact that can be achieved when industry joins hands with humanity. The newly constructed infrastructure boasts advanced medical needs, essential amenities and thus ensuring comprehensive and efficient health care services.

“WHEELS OF COMPASSION” Vehicle for Cochin Cancer Society

Cancer is a complex disease that requires continuous medical care and treatment. Cancer patients rely on strong support systems including palliative care and hospice care. Cochin Cancer Society is an organization led by renowned oncologists in the city, that helps patients to lead a normal life.

Treatment methods include chemotherapy or radiotherapy, for which transportation is often a vital component. Patients and care takers need to travel to the hospital on a daily basis and to cater this; an enhanced transportation system is required.



To ease this transportation difficulty, Cochin Shipyard Limited extended support for the purchase of a new vehicle. This vehicle is also utilized for free food distribution in the hospitals on a daily basis. Hence, this initiative benefits patients in the form of access to free transportation during the course of treatment.



“AGEING GRACEFULLY” Project for the Elderly at Bethlehem Abhayabhavan Charitable Society, Koovappady

Bethlehem Abhayabhavan Charitable Society is an organization that has been creating lasting change in the lives of distressed people, specifically the mentally ill and geriatric person in Kerala for the past two and half decades. The venture that started with 5 inmates, today has about 450 members. Cochin Shipyard Limited undertook a transformative construction project to create a new building specially designed to accommodate and serve the needs of the elderly individuals.

The continued commitment of the CSL to the vulnerable sections of the society resulted in a partnership with Bethlehem Abhayabhavan for the support of improving the building so as to promote the psycho-social rehabilitation of the elderly.

“REDIFINING HYGIENE FACILITIES” Construction of Toilet Complex for Boys & Girls at St. Mary’s HS, Kandanad

St. Mary’s High School, Kandanad is a 100-year-old educational institution having more than 1000 students studying in it. The institution also provide education to number of differently abled students who need proper facilities when it comes to hygiene in particular.

The present-day old-fashioned facilities needed a facelift. The institution working in the rural setting is unable to raise money to provide decent facilities to the students who are from a very poor background.

Recognizing the critical importance of sanitation facilities in educational institutions, CSL took up rebuilding the toilet complex for both boys and girls with facilities to accommodate differently abled.



Currently the students can access quality and hygienic sanitary facilities. This initiative not only enhances the physical infrastructure of the school but also instils a sense of dignity and self-respect among the student community



“SIGHTS AND SOUNDS OF HISTORY” Audio- Visual infrastructure at Kerala History Museum

Opened in the year 1987, Kerala Museum at Edapally, Kochi, India, is one of the oldest arts and history museums in Kochi. It is managed by the Madhavan Nayar Foundation, a registered Public Charitable Trust, established in 1984, founded by philanthropist and entrepreneur R. Madhavan Nayar.

The Kerala History Museum provides interactive, engaging and experiential arts and history-based learning. Easy and effective learning about the history can be unlocked through audio-visual learning.



Cochin Shipyard Ltd., has helped the foundation to set up the audio-visual room in a dedicated area where visitors can engage with historical information and artefacts through audio and visual media.

Alphons Sadhan, the school for differently abled is a solace for the children who need special care and support. They are valued and trained to become self-dependent individuals. The organization has 104 children who require more time and space to overcome their several problems.

The project will be a life changer for the children as they will be able to enhance physical and mental wellbeing and also be able to become a productive member of the society. The initiative of the CSR wing of Cochin Shipyard Limited builds a chance for a better future, where dreams can be pursued and potential can be unleashed.



‘BEYOND SCAVENGING’ Pioneering a Path to Dignity and Progress

In the shadows of our bustling cities, hidden from the glimmering façade of progress, exist unsung heroes, “manual scavengers”, who bear the weight of our waste and the burden of degrading inhuman labour. Manual scavenging exposes them to hazardous work environments, causing risk to life and health. Their hands, calloused and weary, delve into the depths of manholes, unearthing the filth that society discards. The plight of manual scavengers represents a grave violation of human rights.

Large disposal of wastes in cities, coupled with inadequate drainage systems, poses significant environmental issues. The exponential increase in waste generation in cities due to urbanization leads to pollution and contamination of ecosystems, posing health risks to humans. To mitigate these challenges, it is crucial to implement comprehensive waste management strategies. CSL being a frontrunner in technology adaptation believes that science and technology has solutions for many of our problems.



To address this issue, Cochin Shipyard Limited has been a catalyst of transformation by undertaking an initiative along with M/s GenRobotics who have successfully developed and put in place innovative robotic technology across various cities in the country. The equipment, ‘Bandicoot’ can withstand harsh conditions and navigate through complex underground environments to diminish the entire concept of inhuman manholes and manual scavenging. The system includes sensors, object recognition and human operations that would be incorporated by the existing workers through training and transforming them as ‘Robotic operators’ thus ensuring an upgradation of their social status. To negate the gender differences, CSL is also planning to include women as operators to make them financially stable and socially responsible individuals. Bandicoot is the most elegant, efficient and economical way of maintaining manholes in our cities. The project is owned and operated by the M/s C-HED, the NGO promoted by Kochi Municipal Corporation.



FREEDOM PADS

Sanitary Napkin Manufacturing Unit at District Jail, Ernakulam.



The taboos and stigmas associated with the term ‘jail’ creates a perpetuating cycle of shame and exclusion, hindering the reintegration of inmates into the society. These stereotypes develop a feeling of hopelessness among the inmates, especially women due to the societal image and perceptions.

Due to this, women are often trapped into a state of psychological distress and emotional traumas. To address this issue Cochin Shipyard Limited incorporates an initiative that takes in account the skill enhancement and subsequent development of such women.

Manufacturing sanitary napkins by women is a beneficial way as they become the producers and consumers at the same time. The venture is also helpful to generate income by selling the product through the outlets of the jail at a reasonable rate. These skills can be valuable for future employment opportunities and contribute to their reintegration into society after release.

Cochin Shipyard partnered with M/s Bumeric India, an NGO who has been in the business of women empowerment for the past several years, to set up a unit in the District Jail premises, Ernakulam, and impart training and provide continued support.

By promoting women’s health and hygiene, Cochin Shipyard Limited recognizes the importance of menstrual hygiene and its impact on women’s health and is contributing to the overall and holistic well-being of the community.



“REVAMPING SCHOOL GROUND”

Renovation of the school ground St. Joseph’s U.P. School Kadavanthara

St. Joseph’s U.P. School Kadavanthara is a 100-year-old government – aided school, where more than 120 students hailing from migrant families, making it one of the largest schools in Kochi having migrant students. These children do not have the space to engage in outdoor activities, as the school ground is water logged and underdeveloped.

Recognizing the need for education and leisure activities, Cochin Shipyard Limited undertook a project to support the renovation of the school ground in order to provide opportunities to students for extracurricular activities. The impact of the project is to develop the outdoor area for creative utilization of the skills and capabilities of the children.



The inclusion of outdoor activities fosters a sense of personality development and social integration. Cochin Shipyard Limited has created a positive impact in the lives of these students offering them a conducive environment to thrive academically and socially.



“HELPING HANDS”

Construction of Palliative Care Building at Pelican Centre, Kanjiramattom

Palliative care focuses on providing comprehensive support to patients and to alleviate pain and discomfort. Pelican Centre is a psychosocial rehabilitation centre with around 150 inmates that provides quality interventions to help them regain their rightful place in the mainstream society. Cochin Shipyard Limited has embarked on a noble endeavour by constructing a palliative care building and a Stretcher lift facility to provide compassionate care for mentally challenged individuals.

The project signifies the commitment to support vulnerable lives and to enhance the quality of care for those in need. With the installation of the lift facility, bed-ridden patients can be easily shifted to different floors. The building would create a safe and nurturing environment based on the needs of the patient, not on the patient’s prognosis.

Through this initiative Cochin Shipyard Limited exemplifies their dedication to social responsibility and their profound impact on society. This construction is a helping hand that offers solace and support to the inmates and their families, as they journey through life with dignity and passion.

“CREATING SPACE FOR GROWTH” Infrastructure Development of Two Schools in Bathery, Wayanad

Schools in India often lack essential facilities that allow children to study properly. This forces many students especially girls to dropout. With regard to this problem, CSL in collaboration with Ennoble India Foundation undertook a school infrastructure revamp project in the aspirational district of Wayanad.

CSL came up with a change in the usual infrastructural development. Along with adding basic amenities to the school building, the project enhanced the overall quality of the education system. This was achieved by introducing creative spaces within the school premises that ignites the spark of curiosity in our young learners.



The project ensured providing students access to essential school infrastructure in order to create a conducive learning environment instilling a sense of responsibility. The project increased student’s attendance, engagement and improved the learning outcomes.

Prior to this project the schools had leaking roofs, lack of drinking water, electricity and toilet facilities. The school walls now are adorned with captivating visuals, educational diagrams and thought-provoking puzzles that encourages the students to seek knowledge beyond the confines of textbooks. Currently with this intervention of CSL, both the schools have an elevated infrastructural development.



“GIVING A CLEAR VISION” Eye Medical camp for Tribal Population, Wayanad

The aspirational district of Wayanad has a sizable tribal population, which constitutes about 30% of the total population, living in remote inaccessible tribal hamlets

Issues relating to eye sight have not been getting attended as a priority healthcare particularly among the tribal community. A clear vision functions better communications and enhances quality of life and early identification and detection can prevent blindness to a



Tribal communities are at a high risk for adverse health outcomes due to preventable health conditions. To prevent vision loss, “Sakshama”, an institution working among the physically challenged communities, in partnership with Cochin Shipyard limited incorporates a series of Eye Medical Camps for the tribal population in different villages at Sulthan Battery, Wayanad.

The project involving voluntary services from the reputed ophthalmologists includes comprehensive eye screening for eye diseases, training and development of local youth, awareness programs and screening tests.



“LIVELIHOOD THROUGH MUSIC”

The tribal community in aspirational district Wayanad are traditionally very talented in their traditional music, art and culture. Using this prowess of the tribal community, Secret of Music Charitable Trust, headed by a renowned film music director, designed a skill development programme to showcase their musical talent by developing a Tribal musical band.

In collaboration with Cochin Shipyard Limited, the Trust commenced a music club to provide training sessions to the tribal people in Wayanad.



The purpose of this project is to preserve and promote visual arts among the tribal community in Wayanad, give them stage confidence and a platform to express their talents and capabilities which in turn provides them a living.



"GOAL BY GOAL, TRIBE BY TRIBE" Endeavour for Tribal Football Excellence

CSL has numerous projects that work for the progress of the aspirational district of Wayanad that is a house to different tribal communities. The Parappur Football Club aims at finding budding talents in football, especially from deprived rural Wayanad district and nurture them into being professionals.

To promote the skills and abilities of the tribal kids and to bring them to the limelight, this initiative serves as a catalyst, instilling confidence and fostering a sense of achievement among tribal youth.



The project not only offers a platform for athletic achievement but also acts as a space for personal growth, community empowerment, and the sustainability of tribal competencies.



The venture would boost the self-esteem of the youth in order to make them future leaders and contributors to the betterment of the society

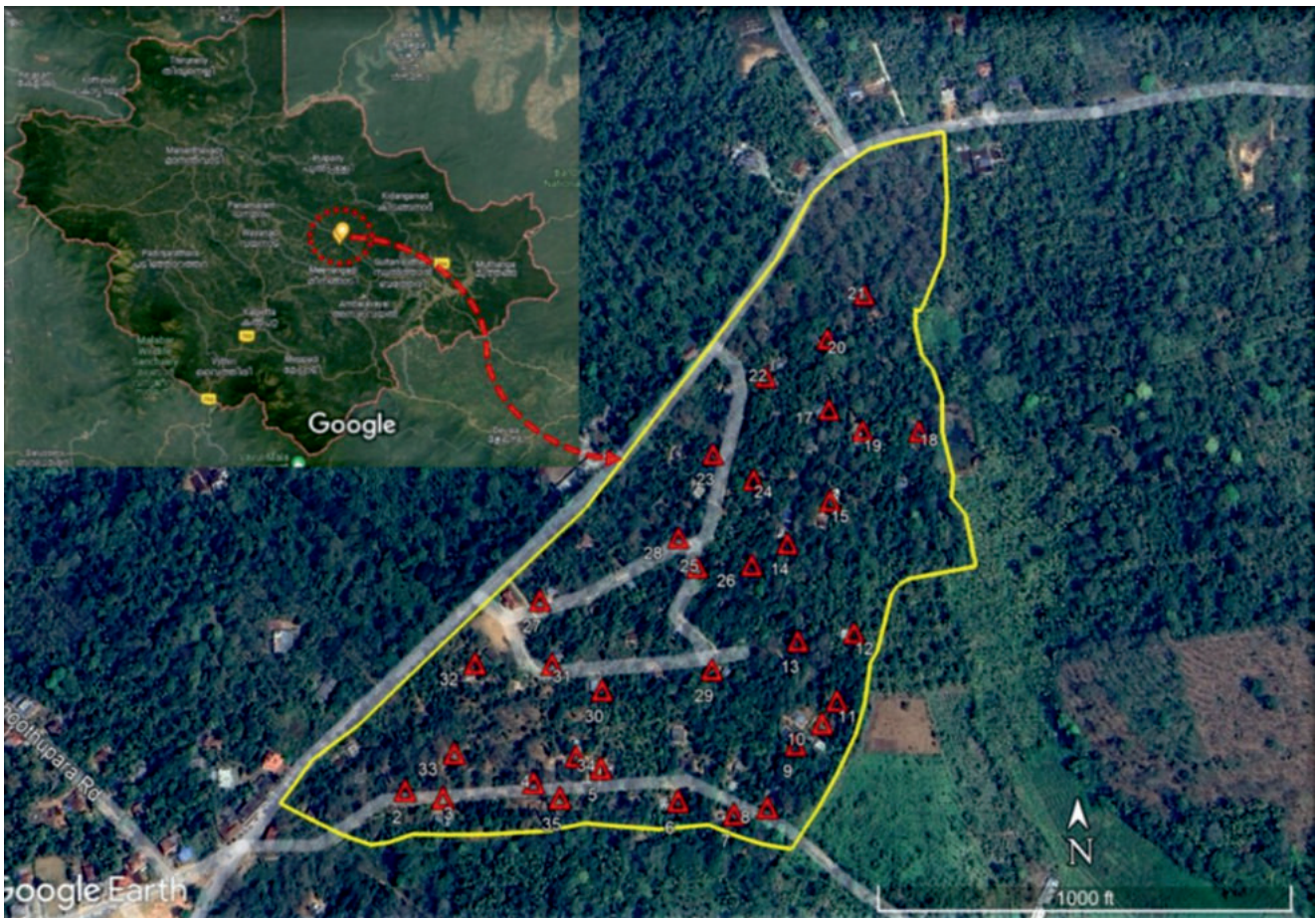
Water Conservation Measures to Mitigate Drought Effects in Meenangadi Noolpuzha Panchayat, Wayanad

Meenangadi Panchayat in the aspirational district Wayanad is a severe drought prone zone, having a strong tribal population. The Panchayat relies on village wells, which go dry mostly during summer.

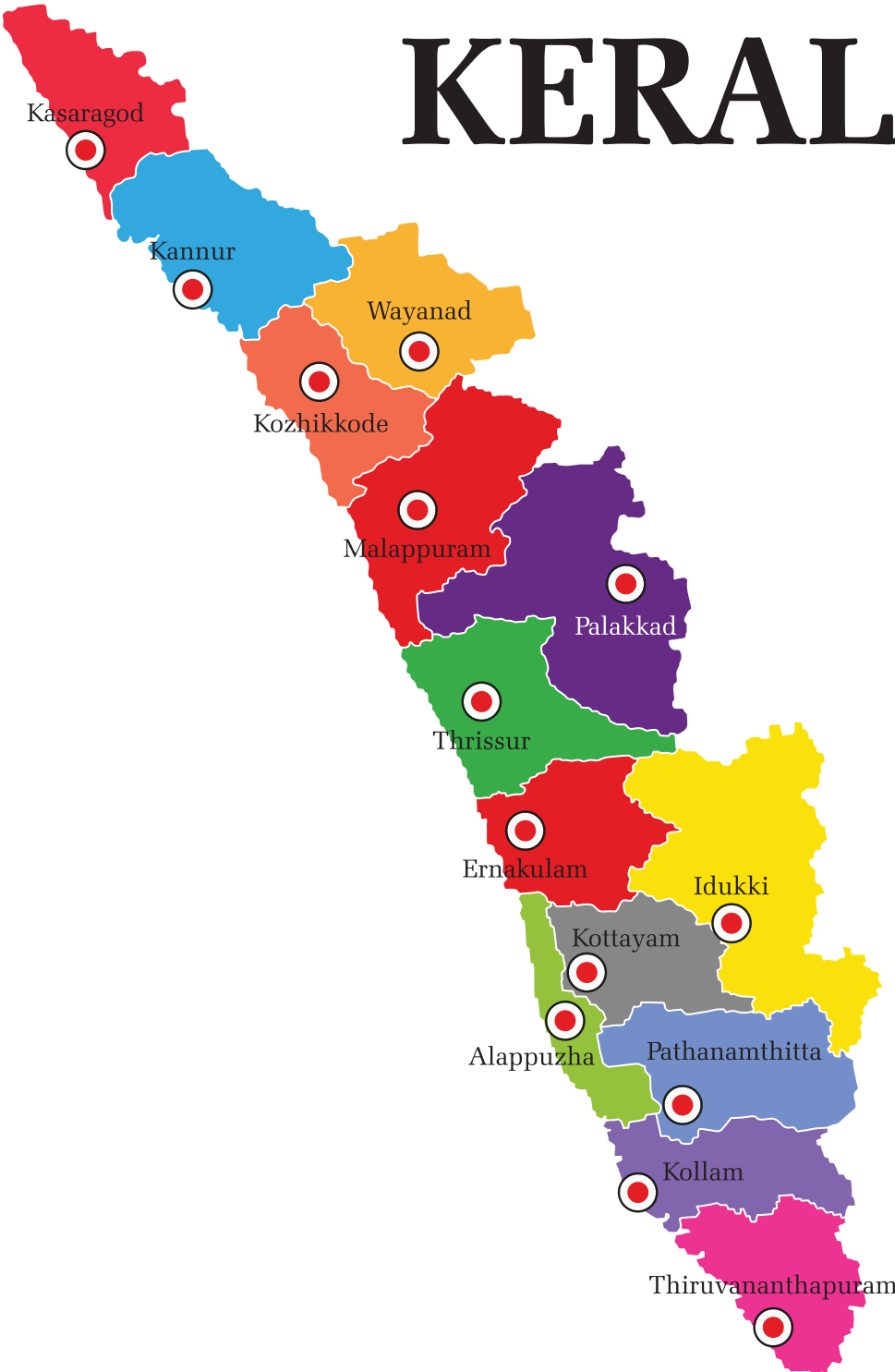
To address the water scarcity issues and thereby enable sustainable water supply and agricultural livelihood of the inhabitants, the conservation of water resources and judicious consumption is a key long-term strategy. CSL took proactive steps to handle the situation.

The project intends to identify and prioritize drought issues, implementation of water conservation measures and providing awareness and training programs on scientific water conservation techniques. The activities further include construction of appropriate water conservation structures, de-siltation of existing tanks/ponds and rejuvenation of roof top rainwater harvesting systems.

Other interventions include introduction of modern irrigation techniques like wick irrigation in select places.

SIGNIFICANT PROJECTS IN THE STATE OF KERALA OUTSIDE HOME DISTRICT



WATER WATER EVERYWHERE. NOT A DROP TO DRINK

Kuttanad region of the District Alapuzha, located close to Ernakulam district, where CSL has its major operations is known to be the Venice of the East for its beautiful backwater and canal system. Kuttanad Wetland Agriculture System is unique, as it is the only system in India that favours rice cultivation below sea level in the land created by draining delta swamps in brackish waters.

Due to the nature of water and use of pesticides in the paddy cultivation, the water is not fit for consumption. Due to difficulty in laying pipelines in the villages, which are mostly surrounded by water, there is no provision of piped drinking water.



The district administration in consultation with M/s Livinguard having patented technology in community water filters, proposed to set up community water filters at three remote locations, one of which is a majority SC area.

Providing of electricity, maintenance of the 200 lr/hr capacity community water filters and testing of water samples at regular intervals will be the responsibility of the local ward members of the Panchayat.



“HANDS OF HOPE” Infrastructure Upgradation of Devashrayam Rehabilitation Centre, Palakkad

Devashrayam is a 27-year-old NGO involved in social activities in Palakkad District of Kerala. They are running a rehabilitation center with 60 differently abled members. These children need proper care and support system to perform their daily activities. Infrastructure is a major component in providing vocational activities and thus achieving better outcomes from the children.



Cochin Shipyard has provided support to construct expansion of the facility to house the skill development center and sensory therapy unit. The project aims to ensure that the rehabilitation centre is fully functional with proper infrastructure and amenities.



“PIONEERING PROGRESS IN HEALTHCARE” Construction of Medical Centre at Kasturba Gandhi National Memorial Trust, Nedupuzha, Thrissur

The Kasturba Gandhi National Memorial Trust is an organisation dedicated to the development of women and children in rural India. It was founded by Mahatma Gandhi in 1945 in dedication to his deceased wife Kasturba Gandhi. It has its headquarters in Kasturbagram, Indore, Madhya Pradesh. It has branches in 22 States and focuses on health care, education, vocational training and employment.[1] In 2008, the Government of India conferred the Indira Gandhi Award for National Integration upon the trust.

The centre in Thrissur District is running an old age home for elderly women and a school among other social activities in the locality.



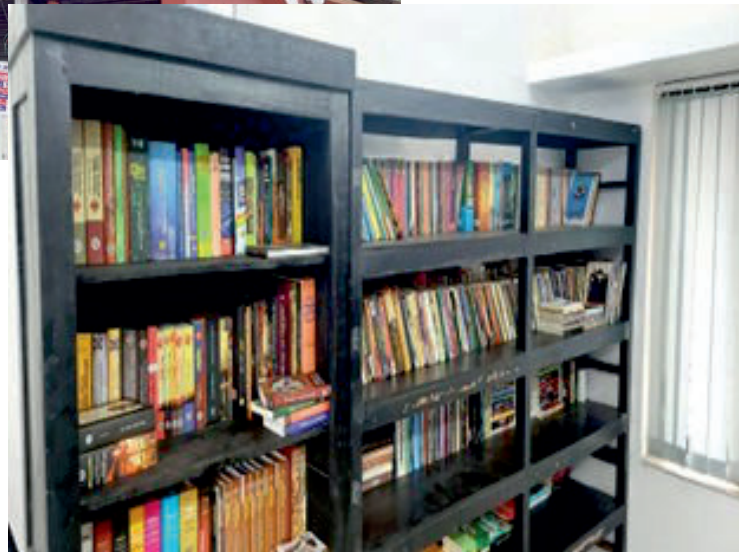
The institution approached CSL to establish a Medical Centre within the premises, which has been successfully completed and running with the CSR support of CSL. The facility is of great help for the destitute women who fall sick and need palliative care.



“A CANVAS OF CREATIVITY” Renovation of M I Raman Memorial Library (Arts and Sports Club)

Village Poomala in Idukki District is a sleepy tribal settlement area having a sizeable population of tribal community along with others.

Library is now a redefined space – a place where not only literature but arts and sports thrive as well, fostering a rich and inclusive community. It provides an environment to nurture creativity through arts clubs, while also promoting physical wellbeing by providing platforms for sports enthusiasts to engage in recreational activities.



To promote this dynamic space, Cochin Shipyard Limited extended hands to renovate the M.I. Raman Memorial Library. The company has helped to turn the space into a vibrant community center, inspiring individuals to explore their passions, cultivate their talents and embrace a holistic approach to personal growth.

The social responsibility of Cochin Shipyard Limited is illustrated from their efforts into contributing for the empowerment of today's youth that are tomorrow's future.



“FUN GROUND FOR THE FUTURE” Construction of kid’s park at Government LP School, Mully

Mully village is one of the remotest tribal hamlets located bordering Tamil Nadu State in Attappadi region of Palakkad District. The majority of the tribal community are culturally very rich and diverse.



Government LP School located in the hamlet is the only educational institution having very limited facilities. With the intention to improve the cognitive development, social skills and self-confidence of the students, an impressive space for the students to play and spend time is important as this helps improve their physical and mental health.

With this vision, Cochin Shipyard Limited helped to construct a park for the students which will improve their mental, physical and motor skills. At present the students of the school and the nearby children can access the facilities easily.



“ROARING TO THE RESCUE” Wildlife Rescue Vehicle to Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation (PTCF)

Parambikulam Tiger Reserve is a protected area lying in Palakkad and Trichur districts, which has road access to it only through the state of Tamil Nadu. The reserve was established in the seventies and eighties. The Western Ghats including Parambikulam Wildlife Sanctuary has been declared by the UNESCO as world heritage site. Parambikulam Tiger Reserve is among the top-ten best managed Tiger Reserves in India.

People from tribal colonies inside the reserve are engaged as guides for treks and safaris, and are provided employment through various eco-tourism initiatives.



Parambikulam Tiger Conservation Foundation formed by the Reserve having members from the Forest Department and the local tribal community approached CSL for a Wildlife Rescue Vehicle to be operated in the large forest area.

This venture aims at facilitating movement of personnel, materials and emergency needs, such as wildlife rescue missions to remote interior areas. Additionally, it is equipped with communication systems and emergency response equipment, ensuring effective interaction with the rescue team and local authorities.

The project serves as a symbol of concerted efforts towards ensuring the long-term conservation of the region's precious wildlife resources.



"ELEVATING CARE, ENRICHING LIVES" Constructs Women's Elderly Shelter Care

Sree Parameshwari Grama Seva Smithy Mathrusadanam has been providing shelter and care for elderly mothers since 2018. Earlier the facility accommodated only 8 mothers and to extend care and shelter to more individuals, Cochin Shipyard Limited intervened to support the enlargement of the building.

The construction of the first floor marks a significant milestone in the journey towards creating a haven for elderly women. The additional space could accommodate expanded living areas, specialized medical facilities, and common spaces designed to foster social interaction and emotional well-being.



Cochin Shipyard Limited is creating a tangible impact on the lives of elderly women, offering them a sense of belonging and security.



“ANCHORING SUPPORT” Blood Storage Unit, THQH, Peermade

Peermade Taluk in Idukki District is a small sleepy town in the High ranges of Kerala. Hosting number of tea plantations, the region has a sizeable number of workmen population employed in tea plantations.

Peermade Taluk Head Quarters Hospital (THQH) is the only major medical facility in the locality and the people, mainly estate workers who can't afford private healthcare, depend on this.

The authorities approached Cochin Shipyard which have significantly contributed to the healthcare landscape through infrastructural development in an area where timely quality health access is limited to the common people. The support envisaged was to set up a blood storage unit, which is a sophisticated facility, to address the issues relating to increased number of delivery cases and also increased number of road accident cases in the hospital, as they had to depend on the nearby medical colleges which are located in far-away places.



Addressing the stringent safety protocols and considering the social responsibility, Cochin Shipyard Limited ensured a sustainable and reliant blood storage facility that helps the hospital for starting delivery and caesarean services. The support included blood bank refrigerators, incubator, air conditioner etc., to preserve the quality of donated blood and to ensure timely medical procedures.



“SKILLS BEYOND LIMITATIONS” Skill development Centre for differently abled

For people who are differently abled, particularly the visually challenged, life is not easy and carrying out daily tasks for survival is a big challenge. To lessen the trials and tribulations faced by them, improvement of skills and development of a support system to provide self-sustenance for them is necessary.

Cochin shipyard Limited’s initiative to join hands with Samadhrushti Charitable Trust, Kozhikode, for setting up a skill development centre is a step in this direction. Training differently abled people and involving them, in skill development activities will help to bring them into the mainstream of the society and make them empowered and earn for their livelihood.

This initiative will help the differently abled bring out their full potential and enhance their skills to become productive members of the society.

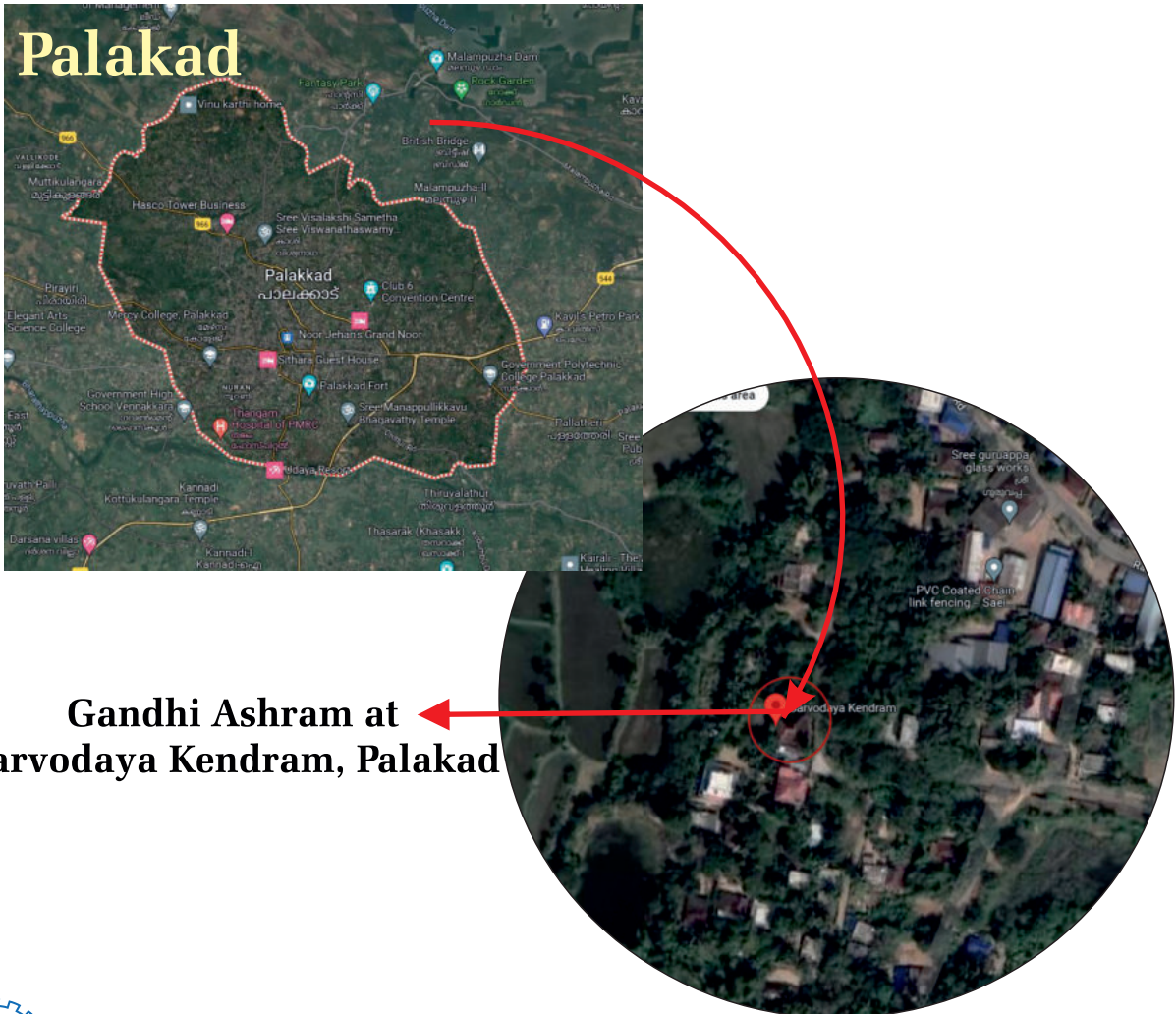
“SANCTUARY OF EMPOWERMENT”

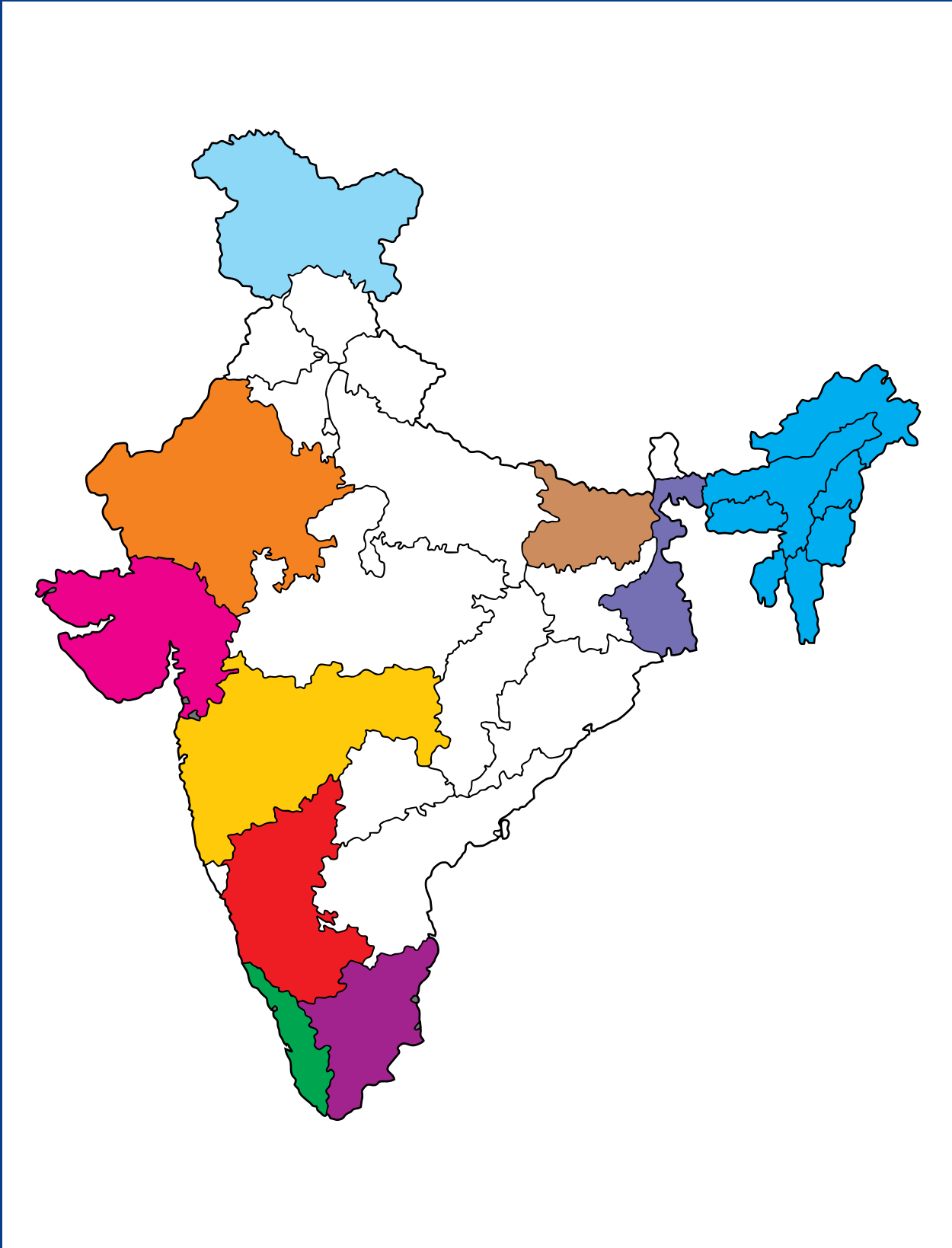

The medical van, with the basic amenities provided along with the project operates within the region, visits remote villages and offer services of the doctor.



"PATHWAYS TO EMPOWERMENT" Shakti - Women Empowerment Centre

One of the prominent projects undertaken by Cochin Shipyard Limited outside the state of Kerala, wherein the empowerment and upliftment of women was taken into consideration with project Shakti - creating two women development centers at Rajasthan one in the urban setting in the city of Jaipur and another in a rural area at Raj Samand District.

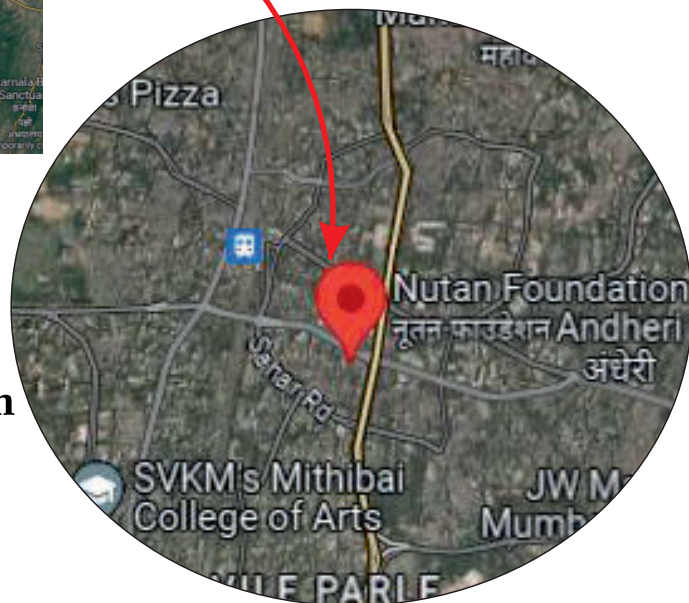
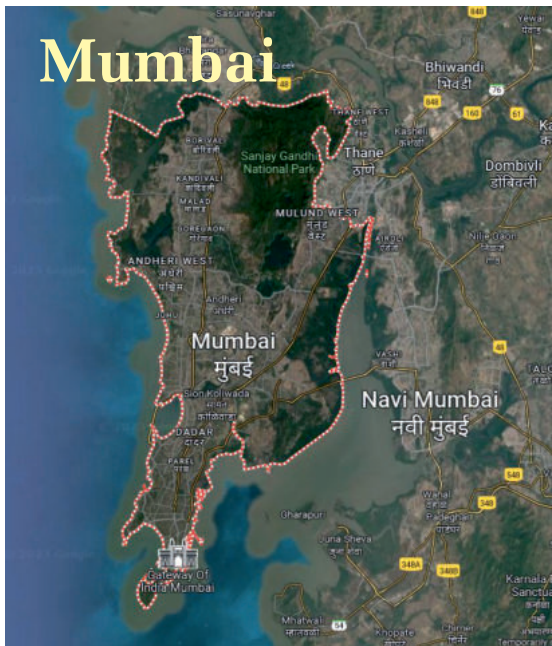


“SHELTER OF CARE” Dormitory for differently abled

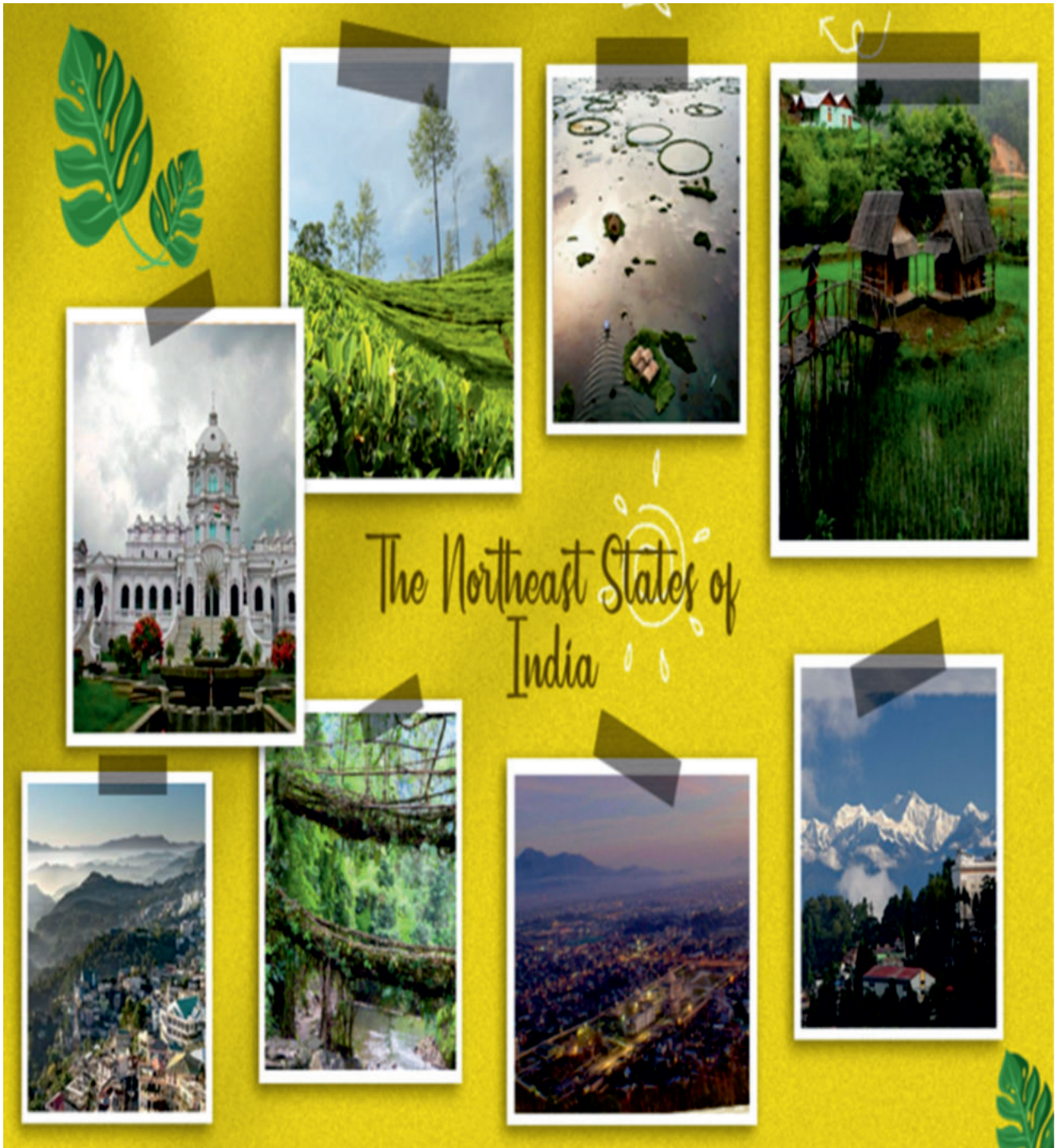

DRINKING WATER PROJECT – IN THE SCHOOLS OF DIBRUGARH

In 2019, the Indian government announced that by 2024 it aims to provide safe and adequate drinking water to all households in rural India through plumbed connections under its flagship scheme, Jal Jeevan Mission.



People in Assam's Dibrugarh region are reeling under a severe drinking water crisis, forcing them to consume contaminated water containing harmful substance like fluoride, arsenic, iron, etc. causing serious water borne diseases like diarrhoea cholera, dysentery, etc.

The lack of clean and plentiful water on the tea estates – and the fact that the habit of filtering water is almost entirely absent – means that diseases such as cholera and typhoid are common.

Cochin Shipyard in association with M/s TIPKAI, Guwahati, installed 1000 lr / hr capacity purifiers of water drawn from the tube wells dug in the nine government schools and one sports stadium, in Dibrugarh district for the public.

On an average 500 children studying in each school are the direct beneficiaries of this project.



"Stretching a helping hand from deep South to North East" Transforms Nagaland with 22 RO Plants"

Nestled in the picturesque landscapes of Nagaland, a pressing issue continues to plague its communities—the scarcity of safe and clean drinking water. The region's challenging geographical terrain, coupled with inadequate infrastructure and limited water resources, has enlarged this problem, leaving thousands of residents grappling with daily water-related hardships.

The Investment and Development Authority of Nagaland (IDAN) along with the hands of Cochin Shipyard Limited has undertaken a momentous initiative to alleviate Nagaland's persistent drinking water problem by setting up 22 Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants across the

The provision of clean drinking water not only quenches immediate thirst but also safeguards the community's well-being, curbing the spread of waterborne diseases and promoting overall development.

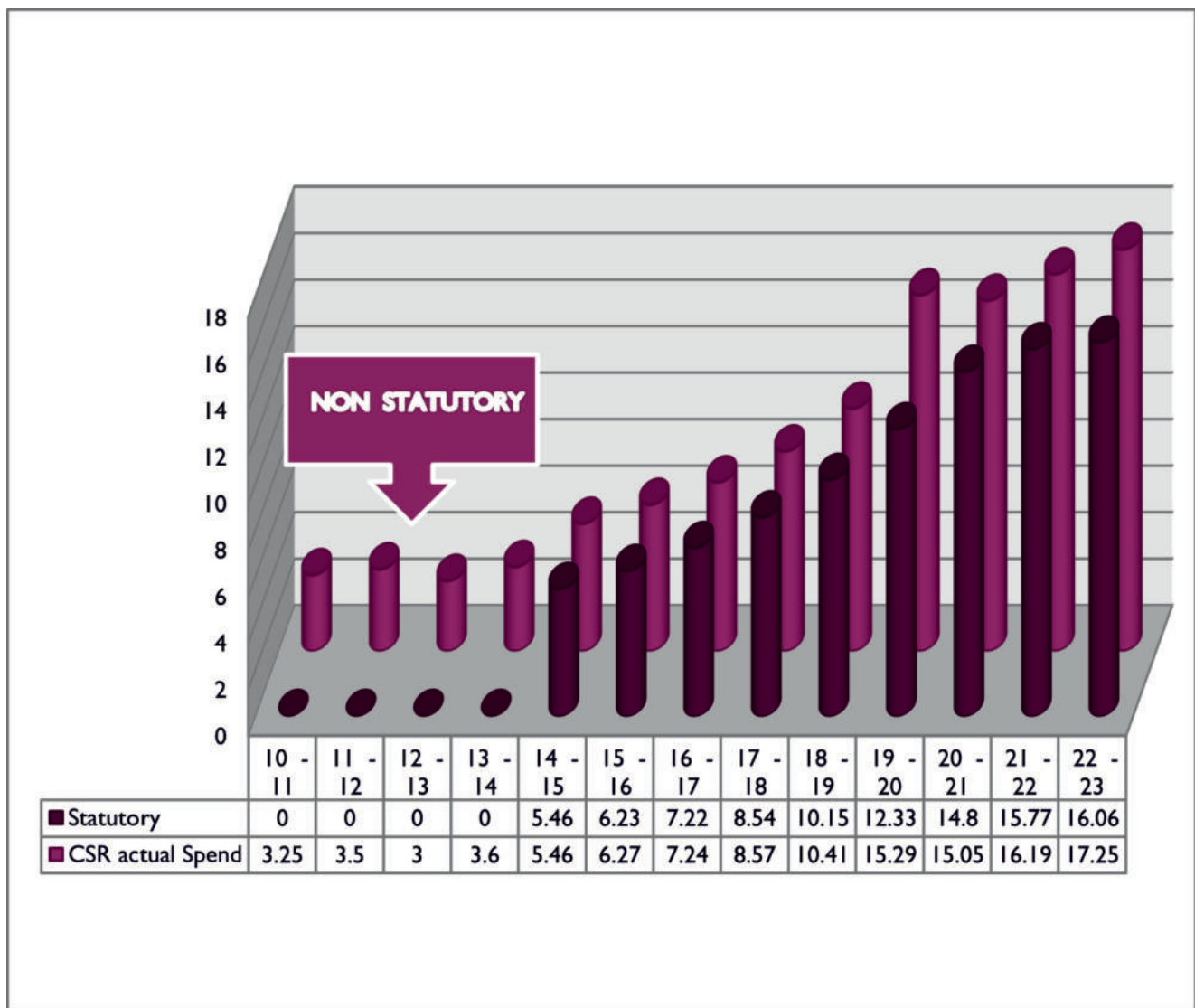


ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE PAST 10 YEARS:
