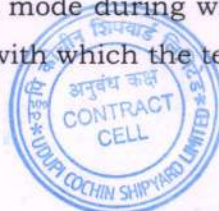

3. Mode of Submission of Quote:

- iii. **Part I and Part II are to be protected with separate and distinctly different passwords.**
- iv. The Bids will be opened on online mode during which the bidder will be advised to share the password through SMS with which the technical bid will be opened.





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- v. The price bids will be opened after technical evaluation and **only the technically qualified bidders will be invited for opening of price bids** which shall also be conducted on online mode as above.

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TERMS AND CONDITIONS

TENDER FOR HIRING OF SKILLED CARPENTER THROUGH AGENCY ON CONTRACT

1. DESCRIPTION OF WORK

- 1.1. This requirement pertains to the awarding of contract for carry out the provide 2 Nos. of skilled carpenters on a regular basis for carrying out carpentry and related accommodation works at Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited (UCSL), Malpe, as directed by the UCSL Officer-in-Charge.
- 1.2. The Manpower engagement as carpenter is to be carried out at Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited facility at Malpe, in Udupi district, Karnataka.
- 1.3. The Agencies are advised to familiarize themselves with the site conditions before quoting.
- 1.4. Bidders are requested to obtain clarifications, if any, and carefully study the documents and the scope of work of Contractor and UCSL, before submitting/Finalizing their offer.

2. MINIMUM QUALIFICATION CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPATING IN THE TENDER WILL BE AS FOLLOWS

- 2.1. The contractor shall have minimum experience of two years in providing carpenter, skilled manpower in shipyard, Marine, and offshore field companies.
- 2.2. The Tenderer should enclose copy of EPF (if applicable), ESI (if applicable), PAN, GST registration certificate, Income tax returns for last three years. (A copy of the same shall be submitted along with the application for issue of tender document).
- 2.3. Offers from joint ventures/consortium will not be accepted.
- 2.4. Net worth of the contractor must be positive as per the latest balance sheet. (MSME/NSIC will get exemptions)

3. SCOPE OF WORK:

The carpenters shall be capable of carrying out the following works:

- 3.1. Planning, polishing and finishing of wooden components.
- 3.2. Preparation of wooden joints and related carpentry works.
- 3.3. Furniture assembly and installation.
- 3.4. Modular furniture/panel assembly.
- 3.5. Application of wood protection coatings, wherever required.
- 3.6. Handling and operation of portable woodworking machines and hand tools.
- 3.7. Handling, installation and adjustment of modular and accommodation panels.
- 3.8. Installation of hardware and associated fittings.
- 3.9. Fabrication and installation of frame ladders and wooden platforms, wherever required.



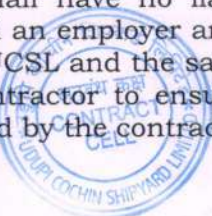


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3.10. Any other miscellaneous carpentry works as instructed by the UCSL Officer-in-Charge.

4. **SCOPE OF CONTRACTORS.**

- 4.1. **Tools and Equipment;** All tools, portable woodworking machines, hand tools and other equipment required for execution of the work shall be arranged and maintained by the contractor at their own cost.
- 4.2. **Working at Height:** Where carpentry work is required at height, frame ladders and wooden platforms required for carrying out the work at single height shall be arranged by the contractor.
- 4.3. **Additional Manpower:** The initial requirement shall be 2 Nos. of carpenters. In case of any future requirement, UCSL may instruct the contractor to provide additional carpenters sufficiently in advance. Such additional manpower shall be provided on a pro-rata basis at the agreed rate, subject to the requirement and approval of UCSL.
- 4.4. **Consumables:** All consumables and raw materials normally required for carrying out the carpentry works shall be provided by UCSL. Proper planning, utilization, handling, and upkeep of the materials and consumables issued by UCSL shall be the responsibility of the deployed workmen to avoid the hold ups in taking up the works. Any misuse, avoidable wastage, damages, or loss of UCSL-supplied raw materials/consumables attributable to the contractor shall be assessed by UCSL, and the corresponding cost shall be recovered from the contractor's monthly bill.
- 4.5. **Muster Roll:** Maintenance of the muster roll/attendance record for the deployed carpenters shall be the responsibility of the designated carpenter under the direction and supervision of the concerned Production Department Officer of UCSL.
- 4.6. **Material Handling:** Loading, unloading and shifting/handling of carpentry-related materials required for execution of the assigned work shall be within the contractor's scope.
- 4.7. **General Requirements:**
 - a. The contractor shall deploy competent and experienced carpenters capable of independently carrying out the assigned works.
 - b. The contractor shall ensure that the deployed personnel comply with all applicable UCSL safety requirements, work instructions and site regulations. Required PPEs for the workmen is in contractor scope.
 - c. Proper housekeeping at the work location shall be maintained on a daily basis by the workmen. All waste, scrap, and unwanted materials generated during the work shall be promptly cleared and disposed of at the designated locations as instructed by UCSL Officer-in-Charge.
 - d. All works shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the UCSL Officer-in-Charge and in accordance with the instructions issued from time to time.
 - e. The contractor shall be responsible for maintaining the tools, equipment and consumables required for uninterrupted execution of the assigned carpentry works.
- 4.8. All wages, claims, remuneration, dues payable to the said personnel shall be borne by the contractor alone. UCSL shall have no liability to pay these dues, claims or remuneration. In no event, shall an employer and employee relationship accrue/arise implicitly or explicitly between UCSL and the said personnel of the contractor. It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to ensure that no liability falls on UCSL in respect of the personnel deployed by the contractor.

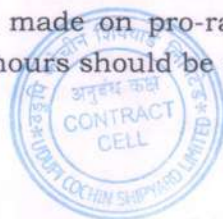




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- 4.9. That where the performance of the persons so deployed by the contractor is not up to the mark or there is a commission of misconduct or disorderly conduct, the contractor shall upon the UCSL's reporting and instructions, immediately withdraw and/or take suitable action against such persons.
- 4.10. The contractor shall not engage or remove or change any person without the knowledge and concurrence of the UCSL Officer-in-charge (AGM- Operation/ his representative). UCSL shall have the right to advise the contractor to terminate the services of any employee (person deployed by the contractor) for any violation of security provisions and / or indiscipline / violent behavior, agitation, instigating other peaceful works. In case of such advice, contractor shall comply with the same with immediate effect with or without assigning any reason and assign a replacement immediately by submitting all the required documents for verification.
- 4.11. Continuous absence of deputed carpenter as required for the duty, may lead to impose of penalty on contractor by UCSL and even may result in cancellation of contract.
- 4.12. The contractor should manage weekly off and leave of personnel and still ensure deployment of people as per Production Department requirement.
- 4.13. Maintenance of muster roll will be the responsibility of designated carpenter under the direction of Production Dept. officer of UCSL.
- 4.14. Contractor will be responsible for any damage caused to the property of UCSL due to negligence of personnel deployed by him for the job. In such cases, he will be charged on account of expenditure arising for repair/replacement of the same.
- 4.15. That for performing the assigned work, the contractor shall deploy medically and physically fit persons who are honest and competent. The contractor shall ensure that the deployed persons are punctual, disciplined and vigilant in performance of their duties. Persons so deployed in UCSL.
- 4.16. The persons to be deployed at all three sites at Malpe, Baputhotta & Hangarkatta of UCSL as per the requirement. Agency has to arrange their own transport with their cost. No extra allowances will be paid for inter site movements.
- 4.17. UCSL will not be responsible for any injury/death caused to the employees provided by Contractor at UCSL. It will be the responsibility of Contractor to abide by all the provisions of the Workmen Compensation Act, 1923 and no compensation, whatsoever shall be paid by UCSL in this regard.
- 4.18. No lodging and boarding will be provided to the carpenter by UCSL.
- 4.19. **Working Hours:** Normal working time shall be from 08:20Hrs to 17:30Hrs with six days working in a week. UCSL holiday calendar will be applicable.
- 4.20. **Extra working hour compensation:** Up on project / site requirements, all personnel have to work beyond normal working hours (within the stipulations of Factories Act), payment will be made on pro-rata basis, per hour Rate = (Monthly Amount/ (26*8). Extra working hours should be sanctioned by Officer-in-Charge





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4.21. It is the prime responsibility of the contractor - to arrange substitutes for the absent employees, if any.

4.22. Food, Transportation & accommodation expenditure in the scope of contractor.

5. UCSL SCOPE OF WORK:

5.1. Providing the required technical specifications.

5.2. Sufficient supply of water will be provided by UCSL.

5.3. Supply of electricity

6. METHOD OF AWARDING CONTRACT

6.1. Contract will be concluded with Bidder qualifying technically (including eligibility criteria), agreeing to Commercial conditions (Annexure VI) and emerging as L1.

6.2. UCSL also reserves the right to split the optional work orders to any number of bidders willing to match with L1 rate, if the performance of selected bidder is not satisfactory.

6.3. UCSL reserves the right to cancel the tender if required.

7. SCHEDULE OF COMPLETION

7.1. The contractor shall follow the UCSL schedule requirements strictly

7.2. Confirmed: 01 (One) Year from 01-10-2026

7.3. Option: Extendable by additional 01 Year if so, required by UCSL. The optional order shall be placed on the performance of the contractor certified by UCSL.

7.4. Mobilization of manpower shall be done within 15 days from the placement of contract.

8. VALIDITY

8.1. The offer shall be valid for a period of 1 Year and no escalation in rate shall be allowed by UCSL on whatsoever reason.

9. RATE

9.1. Rates are to be quoted in the Price Bid Format at Annexure V attached herewith.

10. PAYMENT TERMS

10.1. Payment shall be released on monthly basis within 30 days of receipt of invoice.

10.2. Payment shall be made based on actual number of days deployed by the contractor based on the attendance certified by UCSL.

10.3. The payment shall be released monthly wise in the upcoming month on production of the following documents:

- a) Monthly Duty Roster – certified by the UCSL authorized representative.
- b) Documents and challans, evidencing payment of wages and submission of EPF, ESI, PT and other Statutory payments as per the instructions of UCSL.
- c) Submission of invoice / other relevant documents if any.

10.4. Statutory levies such as I.T, Contribution towards PF, ESI, PT etc., shall be deducted from the bill as applicable.





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10.5. Payment will be made by RTGS/NEFT to the account of Agency. The name of the bank, branch, A/C No., IFSC code & other particulars shall be furnished by the Agency in the proforma of UCSL.

11. TAXES & DUTIES

11.1. GST shall be applicable extra on the prescribed work. You are requested to furnish the following details in the invoice/Bill.

- Applicable rate of GST/SAC Code
- Firms GST Reg. NO.
- Service accounting code (SAC) as prescribed by statutory authorities.
- GST Reg. No. of Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited(29AACT1281B1ZO).

12. PERIOD OF CONTRACT

12.1. Period of contract will be one year from the date of execution of Work order Starting from October 2026. UCSL reserves the right to extend the contract period for a further period of one more year for the same terms and conditions on mutual agreement on completion of the contract period if the performance of the contractor is satisfactory. The rates quoted and all other terms and conditions will remain unchanged for the entire period and also for the extended period (if extended).

13. SECURITY DEPOSIT / PERFORMANCE GURANTEE

13.1. The successful tenderer shall remit security deposit equivalent to payment of 1 month (2 persons as per tender conditions) for the scope of work within 15 days of receipt of the work order / signing of agreement. This amount may be remitted by way of demand draft or bank guarantee (in approved proforma of UCSL) from any of the nationalized banks, valid for a period of 12 months from the contract date. The Security Deposit will be released on certification of satisfactory completion of the contract and no liability to UCSL by Officer-in charge. The Security Deposit retained will not bear any interest.

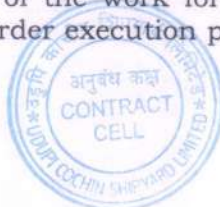
14. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

14.1. The progress of work will be monitored against the mutually agreed detailed schedule. Liquidated damages for delays in engagement of manpower as per the requirement, for any reason other than force majeure conditions, will be recovered at the rate of half percent of the value of the contract per week or part thereof, subject to a maximum of ten (10) percent of the value of the contract.

14.2. For better clarity, order values mentioned in LD clause are values excluding duties and taxes (Basic value). Liquidated damages, if any, shall be decided and settled only after the completion of the entire project but prior to the release of Final stage Payment.

14.3. If, for any reasons, supplier has a justification towards delay in supply / work execution and would intend to consider applicability/ non applicability of LD, the same shall be intimated to UCSL by way of a letter, failing which it will be deemed that delay is attributable to the supplier.

14.4. Delay in supply/Interruption of the work for reasons not attributable to supplier shall entitle extension of the order execution period for proportionate period without any additional cost to UCSL.





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15. POWER OF ATTORNEY

- 15.1. The tenderer(s) shall have to sign in each page of the tender documents with official stamp as a token of his acceptance of the conditions stated therein.
- 15.2. The person signing the tender form on behalf of another or on behalf of a firm, shall enclose to the tender, a Power of Attorney or the said deed duly executed in his favour or the partnership deed giving him such power showing that, he has the authority to bind such other persons or the firm, as the case may be, in all matters pertaining to the contracts. If the Person so signing the tender, fails to enclose the said Power of Attorney, his tender shall be liable for being summarily rejected. The Power of Attorney shall be signed by all partners in the case of partnership concern, by the Proprietor in the case of a proprietary concern, and by the person who by his signature can bind the company in the case of a Limited Company.

16. TERMINATION & LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 16.1. This contract may be terminated upon the occurrence of any of the following events
- 16.2. By agreement in writing of the parties hereto;
- 16.3. By the non-defaulting party, upon default by the other party, of any clause of this contract, if not remedied within fifteen (15) days, or such longer time as may be agreed upon by the parties, after receipt of notice thereof in writing from the non-defaulting party;
- 16.4. By the other party, upon either party;
- i. Making the assignment for the benefit of creditors, being adjudged a bankrupt or becoming insolvent; or
 - ii. Having a reasonable petition filed seeking its' dissolution or liquidation, not stayed or dismissed within sixty (60) days; or
 - iii. Ceasing to do business for any reason.
- 16.5. For fraud and corruption or other unacceptable practices.
- 16.6. Upon expiry or termination of this Contract, neither party shall be discharged from any antecedent obligations or liabilities to the other party under this Contract unless otherwise agreed in writing.
- 16.7. UCSL may by notice in writing to Agency to terminate the order after issuing due notice i.e., 30 days' notice period. UCSL shall be entitled to compensation for loss limited to the order value.
- 16.8. Liability maximum that can be claimed by the Agency shall be limited to what is due to be and has been paid by UCSL for work done as per the payment milestones and limited to work order value.

17. ARBITRATION & JURISDICTION

- 17.1. Any disputes arising during the period of the contract shall, in the first instance be settled by mutual discussions and negotiations. The results of such resolution of dispute shall be incorporated as an amendment to the contract, failing which supplier shall approach the UCSL Grievance Redressal Committee as per relevant clause of the Contract.





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17.2. If any dispute, disagreement or question arising out of or relating to or in consequence of the contract, or to its fulfillment, or the validity of enforcement thereof, cannot be settled mutually or the settlement of which is not herein specifically provided for, then the dispute shall within thirty days from the date either party informs the other in writing that such disputes, disagreement exists, be referred to arbitration. The arbitrators shall be appointed and the arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with and subject to the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (No. 26 of 1996) as amended from time to time and the decision of the Arbitrators shall be final and binding on the parties hereto. The arbitration will be done by a Board comprising one arbitrator nominated by each party, and a mutually agreed Umpire. Each party shall bear its own cost of preparing and presenting its case. The cost of arbitration shall be shared equally by the parties unless the award provides otherwise. Performance under this Contract shall however, continue during arbitration proceedings and no payment due or payable by the parties hereto shall be withheld unless any such payment is or forms a part of the subject matter of arbitration proceedings.

17.3. Seat & Venue of Arbitration: The seat & venue of arbitration shall be at Bangalore.

17.4. Language of Arbitration: The Language of arbitration shall be English.

17.5. Governing Law: The contract shall be governed by Indian Law

17.6. In case of disputes, the same will be subjected to the jurisdiction of courts at Bangalore, Karnataka.

18. SUB CONTRACTING AND ASSIGNMENT

18.1. Contractor shall not assign or transfer the Purchase Order/ Work Order or any share or interest therein in any manner or degree to any third party without the prior written consent of UCSL.

18.2. Contractor shall not contract with any subcontractor and/or vendor without the prior written consent of UCSL. Such consent shall not relieve the Contractor from any of his responsibilities and liabilities under the Purchase Order/ Work Order. In addition, Contractor shall ensure that the terms and conditions of any such contract shall comply with and correspond to the terms and conditions of the Purchase Order/ Work Order.

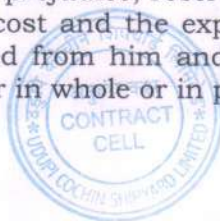
19. SECRECY & RESTRICTION ON INFORMATION TO MEDIA

19.1. The information contained in the enquiry as such shall NOT be communicated to any third party without prior approval of UCSL.

19.2. Information in respect of contracts/orders shall NOT be released to the national or international media or anyone not directly involved in its execution without the written approval of UCSL.

20. CANCELLATION OF ORDER AND RISK CONTRACTING

20.1. In the event the Agency fails to complete the work promptly and satisfactorily as per the terms of the order, and if any work is delayed beyond thirty (30) days from the agreed schedule, UCSL, without prejudice, reserves the right to cancel the order and get the work done at Agency's cost and the expenditure so incurred including any damage or loss will be recovered from him and the Security Deposit furnished by him is liable to be forfeited either in whole or in part.





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20.2. UCSL also reserves to right to impose penalties ranging from Rs. 100 to Rs.500 to the employees of agencies and will be deducted from the bills, for any habitual offence on the cleanliness of uniforms, lack of obedience, not attending the tasks etc., and will be to the discretion of the Officer in charge for the work.

21. FORCE MAJEURE

21.1. Should failure in performance of any part of this contract arise from war, insurrection, restraint imposed by Government act or legislation of other statutory authority, from explosion, riot, legal lock-out, flood, fire, act of God or any inevitable or unforeseen event beyond human control which will be construed as a reasonable ground for extension of time, UCSL may allow such additional time as is mutually agreed to be justified by the circumstances of the case.

22. IMS GUIDELINES

22.1. UCSL implemented an Integrated Management System (IMS) and the Quality Management System (QMS) within the yard. As part of IMS, subcontractors shall comply with the following measures related to the Quality, Health, and Safety & Environment (QHSE) policy of UCSL.

- a) Meeting or exceeding customer requirements.
- b) Assuring quality of the products and service.
- c) Preventing occupational ill health & injuries.
- d) Ensuring safe work sites.
- e) Conserving natural resources.
- f) Preventing / minimizing air, water & land pollution.
- g) Handling and disposal of Hazardous wastes safely.
- h) Complying with statutory & regulatory and other requirements.
- i) Developing skills and motivating employees.

22.2. Occupational Health, safety & Environmental requirements of UCSL shall also include the following.

- a) The contractor (or a sub-contractor performing work on behalf of the contractor) is deemed to comply with the Occupational health, safety and environmental policy of the company and also to all operational controls/standard operating procedures and shall undertake the work in total compliance with the requirements of the established Integrated Management System (IMS) of the company.
- b) The Contractor shall undertake the work in total compliance with all applicable legal/statutory requirements related to occupational health, safety and environment effective in the state of Karnataka.
- c) It is the sole responsibility of the contractor to assure that any sub-contractor/s who shall perform works in company lands/facilities/worksites on behalf of the contractor, is also following all requirements related to the Integrated Management System of the company and the health/safety/environmental Rules effective in the state.
- d) The contractor shall provide/implement and operate/practice all occupational health, safety and environmental management measures/facilities, for their





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period of contract, in their activities/at their work sites, which shall be required according to the IMS of the company or that required by the health/safety/environmental Rules established and effective in the state, at their own cost.

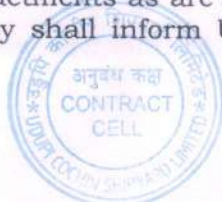
- e) If any contractor failed to comply with or violated any clauses/requirements of occupational health, safety and environmental Rules effective in the state, in their activities or at work sites and the same shall be exposed to the government or any competent authorities upon inspections, the contractor shall be solely responsible for all liabilities caused by his/her action and shall be responsible for paying the penalty and taking stipulated corrective actions insisted by the authorities within the specified time, at their own cost. Any liability to the company in this regard needs to be compensated by the contractor.
- f) Upon completion of the work, contractor shall clear the area and shall not leave any Occupational health/safety/environmental liabilities to the company, from their activities at the worksites.
- g) Any clarification related to IMS requirements of the yard, may be obtained by the contractor from the AGM (HSE) or the authorized representative of the contract, prior to the commencement of work.

23. SAFETY OF PERSONNEL AND FIRST AID

- 23.1. The contractor shall be entirely responsible for the safety of all the personnel employed by him on the work. In this regard, he may adopt all the required safety measures and strictly comply with the safety regulations in force. A copy of UCSL's "Safety Rules for Contractors (Revised)" is available with HSE department for reference.
- 23.2. The Agency may arrange to suitably insure all his workmen/ other personnel in this regard. UCSL will not be responsible for any injury or illness to the Agency's workmen/other personnel during execution of the works due to whatsoever reasons.
- 23.3. In this regard, the Contractor will have to fully indemnify UCSL against any claims made by his workmen/other personnel
- 23.4. The Agency shall provide and maintain so as to be readily accessible during all working hours, a first aid box with prescribed contents at every place where he employs contract labor for executing the works.

24. LABOUR LAWS AND REGULATIONS

- 24.1. The Agency shall undertake and execute the work with contract Labor only after taking license from the appropriate authority under the Contract Labor (Regulation & Abolition) Act 1970.
- 24.2. The Agency shall observe and comply with the provisions of all labour and industrial laws and enactments and shall comply with and implement the provisions of the Factories Act, 1948, Employees Provident Funds & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, Employees State Insurance Act, Payment of Gratuity Act, minimum Wages Act, Payment of Bonus Act, Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act and all other enactments as are applicable to him and his workmen employed by him. The Agency shall inform UCSL his license number from the Central Labour Commissioner.

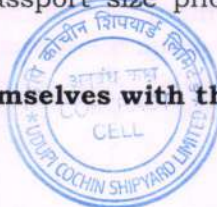




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- 24.3. All Persons, except those exempted under the respective Acts, shall necessarily be insured under the ESI scheme and be made members of the EPF Scheme from the day of their engagement as personnel in the Company. In Case 1, All such insured Persons should carry with them their ESI Identity Card for verification by the authorities. No Persons without a valid ESI Identity Card for verification by the authorities will be permitted to work in the company.
- 24.4. The Agency shall submit the Labour Reports/Returns as required by the Company from time to time in respect of their workmen in standard format to the concerned contracting officer so as to enable the same to reach Contract cell by the 5th of every month. Delayed submission of the same shall attract penal interest /damages at the rate as levied by the respective authorities under the relevant Acts.
- 24.5. The Agency shall maintain the records viz. Muster Roll, Acquittance Roll with full details, Account books etc., in original. These are required for inspection by the concerned authorities under each scheme.
- 24.6. If the Agency fails to pay any contributions, charges or other amounts payable under any of the aforementioned provisions of law, UCSL shall deduct or adjust amounts equivalent to such contribution, charges or amounts from amount payable to him by UCSL, including any deposit or amounts payable against bills and make payments on his account to the appropriate authority. He shall not be entitled to question or challenge such deductions, adjustments or payment made by UCSL.
- 24.7. Any other amount payable under any law or in respect of any person employed by the Agency, if not paid by him, shall be deducted or adjusted by UCSL out of any amount payable to the Agency including any Security Receipt and paid ever or withheld for payment by UCSL.
- 24.8. The Agency shall be fully responsible for the conduct and discipline of the workmen employed by him in the Company premises. If such workmen commit any misconduct or criminal act inside the Company, the Agency shall take appropriate action against such workmen. The Agency shall abide by the instructions/ guidelines issued by the Company for maintenance of discipline and good conduct among the workmen employed by him.
- 24.9. All persons who are engaged for various works in UCSL either directly or through Agency/contractors, should produce the following documents prior to issuing their entry passes:
- 24.10. Passport/Aadhaar attested copy of passport with photo and address particulars.
OR
Police clearance certificate with photo and address particulars. (Police clearance certificate to the effect that the concerned person is staying in the area of jurisdiction of the certificate issuing Police Station and that the person is not involved in any criminal offences as per the records available therein.)
- 24.11. Application and Declaration for enrolling under Employees Provident Fund and ESI Scheme- 3 individual passport size photographs and two copies of family photographs of the members.
- 24.12. **Agency shall familiarize themselves with the labour rules & regulations.**





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25. OVERWRITING & CORRECTIONS

- 25.1. Tenders shall be free from overwriting or erasures. Corrections and additions, if any, shall be duly attested and a separate list of such corrections shall be attached with the offer.

26. PROVISION FOR PENALTY

- 26.1. In case of any theft, pilferage, loss or damage to any equipment or accessories, the Company at its sole discretion, will be entitled to recover cost of such item as per market rates or estimated cost of loss/damage/pilferage from the bill of the contractor and the same will be binding on the Contractor.
- 26.2. If any Power tooler cum cleaner is not found available for the job assigned or found sleeping on duty or found guilty or negligent in performance of his duties, penalty for an amount of Rs.500/- for each such default/offence will be deducted from the bill of the Contractor.
- 26.3. Non-compliance of statutory requirements shall attract a penalty of Rs. 2500/- per instance and shall be deducted from the monthly bill.
- 26.4. Imposing of penalty in a particular month shall be informed to contractor by Engineer-in charge/AGM-Operation. For all of the above points, one appeal against such decisions will be permissible and will be placed before Engineer in Charge/AGM-Operation, whose decision shall be final and binding on the Contractor.
- 26.5. Penalty (if any) shall be applicable only to the contractor and should not affect the salaries of the workforce.

27. OTHER TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 27.1. Quality of services shall conform to the specification/ standards laid down by UCSL.
- 27.2. UCSL reserves the right to accept / reject any offer.
- 27.3. **UCSL reserves the right to award the work to more than one contractor or to take over partially or fully the work depending upon the schedule requirements.**
- 27.4. During the evaluation of tender, officer-in-charge may seek clarifications from the bidders. Clarification if any shall be given in writing/e-mail. Officer-in-charge's decision will be final and binding on the bidder.
- 27.5. Compliance of all statutory safety requirements and other safety rules stipulated by UCSL and other applicable statutory bodies shall be the responsibility of the Agency while working at UCSL premises. The Agency should ensure that their workmen and staff are adequately covered under Insurance.
- 27.6. Damages caused to the Shipyard properties/tools/accessories should be rectified by the Agency at his cost or proportional recoveries will be made from the Agency while passing their bills for payment.





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- 27.7. The service provider shall have to engage men on round the clock basis and also on Sundays and holidays. Service has to be completed to the satisfaction of Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited officer in-charge.
- 27.8. The service provider shall indemnify UCSL or its officers against any claims arising out of accidents or injuries to workmen or other persons or damage to other property which may arise during the execution of the contract or from breach of any Law or Regulation prior to delivery and acceptance of the items at UCSL.
- 27.9. The service provider shall also be governed by the General Conditions of Contract of UCSL, General Safety Rules and other relevant labour laws.
- 27.10. The upper age limit of all workers and supervisors employed by the Agency and those Agency who do or supervise the job themselves shall be as per the prevailing rules of UCSL and shall comply to the requirements of this tender.
- 27.11. Assistant General Manager, or his authorized representative will be the Officer-in-charge of these contracts.

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STATUTORY COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall strictly comply with all applicable provisions of the prevailing Labour Laws, including the **Code on Wages, 2019 (Act No. 29 of 2019)**, **Industrial Relations Code, 2020 (Act No. 35 of 2020)**, **Code on Social Security, 2020 (Act No. 36 of 2020)**, **Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 (Act No. 37 of 2020)**, and all applicable Central/State Rules, regulations, notifications, amendments and statutory requirements. The Contractor shall ensure compliance with the following requirements throughout the contract period:

A. CONTRACTOR COMPLIANCE

1. Employment of Indian Nationals – UCSL Contractual Requirement

Only Indian nationals holding valid citizenship and prescribed identity/address documents shall be engaged for work inside UCSL premises. The Contractor shall verify and maintain appropriate documentary proof before deployment of any person. This requirement is a UCSL contractual/site-access condition and is not a specific requirement prescribed under any particular Labour Code section.

2. Contract Labour Licence – OSH&WC Code, 2020

The Contractor shall obtain and maintain a valid licence for engaging/supplying contract labour wherever the provisions of the Code are applicable. No contractor to whom Part I of Chapter XI applies shall supply or engage contract labour or undertake/execute work through contract labour except under and in accordance with a valid licence. Statutory Reference: Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Sections 45, 47, 48, 50 and 51. Code No.: 37 of 2020.

3. EPF Compliance

The Contractor shall ensure the enrolment of all eligible employees/workmen under the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) scheme and shall timely deposit the applicable employer and employee contributions in accordance with the applicable provisions of law. The Contractor shall maintain all required EPF records, including UAN and contribution details, and shall produce documentary evidence of compliance whenever required by UCSL or the competent statutory authority.

Statutory Reference: Code on Social Security, 2020 – Sections 15 to 21, read with the First Schedule, Chapter III, and applicable Rules, notifications and amendments. Code No. 36 of 2020.

4. ESI Compliance

The Contractor shall ensure coverage of all eligible employees/workmen under the Employees' State Insurance (ESI) scheme and shall timely deposit the applicable employer and employee contributions in accordance with the applicable provisions of law. The Contractor shall maintain valid ESI/e-Pehchan details and all other prescribed records and shall produce documentary evidence of compliance whenever required by UCSL or the competent statutory authority.

Statutory Reference: Code on Social Security, 2020 – Sections 28 to 44, read with the First Schedule, Chapter IV, and applicable Rules, notifications and amendments. Code No. 36 of 2020.

5. Labour Returns and Statutory Reports

The Contractor shall submit all labour/statutory returns and reports required by UCSL or the competent statutory authorities within the prescribed time limits. UCSL-specific monthly Statutory labour reports shall be submitted to the concerned Contracting Officer by the 15th of every month, or within such other period as may be specified by UCSL. Statutory Reference: Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Section 33; Code on Wages, 2019 – Section 50; and applicable Rules.

6. Maintenance of Statutory Records

The Contractor shall maintain all prescribed registers and records, including employee particulars, muster roll/attendance, wages, overtime, deductions, leave, statutory contributions and other records, and shall produce the same for inspection by UCSL or the competent statutory authority whenever required.

Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Section 50; Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Section 33; Code on Social Security, 2020 – applicable record/return provisions and Rules.

7. Timely Payment of Wages

The Contractor shall ensure that wages are paid within the statutory time limit. For employees engaged on a monthly wage period, wages shall be paid before the expiry of the seventh day of the succeeding month. In cases of removal, dismissal, retrenchment or resignation, wages payable shall be paid within two working days, subject to the applicable statutory provisions. Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Section 17(1)(d) and Section 17(2).

8. Minimum Wages and VDA Compliance





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The Contractor shall pay wages not less than the applicable minimum rate of wages and shall promptly implement all revisions in minimum wages and Variable Dearness Allowance (VDA), wherever applicable.

Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, read with applicable notifications/rules issued by the appropriate Government.

9. Overtime Payment

Where overtime is applicable, the Contractor shall pay overtime wages at a rate not less than twice the normal rate of wages. Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Section 14.

Where applicable, workers working beyond the prescribed hours shall be paid overtime at twice the rate of wages, subject to the conditions prescribed under the Code and Rules.

Statutory Reference: Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Section 27.

10. Wage Slips

The Contractor shall issue wage slips to all employees in the prescribed form and manner and shall maintain documentary evidence of wage payment. Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Section 50(3) and applicable Code on Wages Rules, 2026.

11. Attendance, Wage and Overtime Records

The Contractor shall maintain accurate attendance records, including actual entry and exit/working hours wherever required for verification of wages and overtime, together with wage, overtime and deduction records.

Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Section 50 and applicable Rules; Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Section 33.

12. Wage Payment Verification

The Contractor shall make wage payments through bank transfer/digital mode wherever applicable and shall produce bank statements, wage registers, wage slips and other documentary evidence whenever required by UCSL.

Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Sections 15, 17 and 50, read with applicable Rules.

13. Limit on Wage Deductions

The Contractor shall make only those deductions permitted under law, and the total deductions in any wage period shall not ordinarily exceed 50% of wages, subject to the provisions of the Code. Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Section 18(1), 18(2) and 18(3).

14. Payment of Annual Bonus

The Contractor shall pay statutory bonus to eligible employees in accordance with the applicable provisions, including the requirement relating to employees who have worked for at least 30 days in an accounting year, subject to the wage eligibility limits and other conditions prescribed under the Code and Rules.

Statutory Reference: Code on Wages, 2019 – Sections 26 to 41, particularly Sections 26 and 27, read with applicable Rules. Note: The actual bonus calculation and eligibility should be applied as prescribed under the Code/Rules and applicable notifications.

15. Maternity Benefits

Eligible women employees shall be provided maternity benefits and other related benefits in accordance with the Code. A woman shall generally be eligible for maternity benefit where she has actually worked for not less than 80 days during the 12 months immediately preceding the expected date of delivery, subject to the applicable statutory conditions. Statutory Reference: Code on Social Security, 2020 – Sections 60 to 72, particularly Sections 60, 62, 64, 65 and 66.

16. Gratuity

The Contractor shall pay gratuity to eligible employees within the prescribed statutory period. Gratuity shall also be applicable, subject to the statutory conditions, in cases of fixed-term employment and death/disablement where the requirement of five years' continuous service is not applicable. Statutory Reference: Code on Social Security, 2020 – Sections 53 to 58, particularly Sections 53 and 56. Gratuity is required to be paid within 30 days from the date it becomes payable.

17. Gratuity Nomination

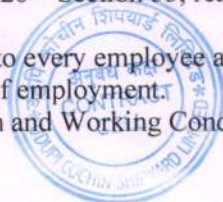
The Contractor shall ensure that eligible employees submit the prescribed gratuity nomination and that all nomination, fresh nomination and modification records are properly maintained and kept in safe custody.

Statutory Reference: Code on Social Security, 2020 – Section 55, read with the applicable Social Security Rules.

18. Appointment Letters

The Contractor shall issue an appointment letter to every employee at the time of appointment, containing the prescribed particulars and terms and conditions of employment.

Statutory Reference: Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Section 6(1)(f).





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19. Annual Health Check-up

The Contractor shall provide the prescribed annual health examination/test free of cost to workers/employees falling within the prescribed categories. Statutory Reference: Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Section 6(1)(c) and applicable Rules.

20. Weekly Rest

The Contractor shall ensure that workers are provided the prescribed weekly holiday/rest and compensatory holiday wherever applicable.

Statutory Reference: Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Sections 25 and 26.

21. Inter-State Migrant Workers – Journey Allowance

In respect of eligible inter-State migrant workers, the Contractor shall provide the prescribed statutory benefits, including a lump-sum amount towards the to-and-fro journey between the place of employment and the native place once in a year, in accordance with applicable provisions.

Statutory Reference: Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – Sections 59, 60 and 61.

22. Discipline and Conduct

The Contractor shall ensure proper conduct and discipline of its workmen within UCSL premises and shall comply with applicable service conditions, grievance procedures and disciplinary requirements. Any misconduct or violation of UCSL rules shall be dealt with appropriately by the Contractor.

Statutory Reference: Industrial Relations Code, 2020 – Sections 29 to 31, as applicable, together with applicable standing orders/rules.

B. IDENTITY, SECURITY AND DOCUMENTATION

23. Identity and Police Verification – UCSL Requirement

Before issuance of entry passes, all personnel shall submit the documents prescribed by UCSL, including valid identity/address proof and, wherever required by UCSL, a police clearance certificate. The Contractor shall maintain copies of such documents and produce them for verification whenever required.

26. Entry Pass and Deployment Control

No person shall be deployed inside UCSL premises unless the required statutory, identity, security and contractual documents have been verified and accepted by UCSL.

24. Pre-Employment Medical Examination: The Contractor shall ensure that all personnel undergo a pre-employment medical examination and obtain a valid medical fitness certificate before deployment at UCSL premises. Statutory Reference: OSH&WC Code, 2020 – Section 6(1)(c), read with applicable Rules.

25. Medical Insurance Where ESI Is Not Applicable: Where ESI coverage is not applicable, the Contractor shall, at its own cost, provide valid medical/health insurance coverage to the concerned personnel throughout their deployment at UCSL and submit proof of coverage when required. **Statutory Reference:** Code on Social Security, 2020 – Sections 28–44, read with applicable Rules.

26. Prohibition of Child Labour: The Contractor shall not employ, engage, or permit any person below the age of 18 years to work under this Contract, and shall strictly comply with all applicable laws relating to the prohibition of child labour.

C. RECOVERY, AUDIT AND OVERALL RESPONSIBILITY

27. Statutory Dues and Recovery by UCSL

If the Contractor fails to pay any statutory contribution, wage, penalty, damages, compensation or other amount payable under applicable labour laws, UCSL shall be entitled, subject to the contract and applicable law, to recover, deduct or adjust such amount from any amount payable to the Contractor, including bills, retention/security amounts or other dues, and may remit the same to the concerned authority wherever legally permissible.

28. Submission of Documentary Evidence

The Contractor shall submit documentary evidence of statutory compliance whenever requested by UCSL, including EPF/ESI challans, ECRs, wage registers, wage slips, bank payment statements, attendance/muster rolls, bonus records, gratuity records, appointment letters, licence copies, health-check records and statutory returns.

29. Continuous Compliance

The Contractor shall familiarize itself with all applicable Labour Laws, Labour Codes, Central/State Rules, notifications, circulars and amendments and shall ensure continuous compliance throughout the contract period. Any amendment, notification or revised statutory requirement issued by the competent authority shall be complied with by the Contractor from the applicable effective date.





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30. Consequence of non-compliance

non-compliance with the above statutory requirements shall constitute a breach of the Contractor's contractual obligations and may result in withholding/recovery of payments, suspension of deployment/entry passes, recovery of statutory dues, or other appropriate contractual action by UCSL, without prejudice to action that may be taken by the competent statutory authorities under applicable law.

Note: The above section references are based on the Labour Codes and the currently applicable statutory framework. The Contractor shall comply with the **applicable Central/State Rules, notifications and amendments in force from time to time**, and where a provision is subject to prescribed conditions, thresholds or exemptions, the same shall be applied accordingly. The official Ministry of Labour & Employment portal currently lists the 2026 Central Rules for all four Labour Codes.
