1. DESCRIPTION OF WORK:

- 1.1. This enquiry pertains to the Hiring of ambulance service round the clock (24hrs) with driver at Malpe & Hangarkatta facility for a period of Two year. It shall be extendable for another one year based on the performance of service provider.
- 1.2. The vehicle hired will be used as dedicated vehicle for the official use of UCSL.
- 1.3. You are requested to understand the scope of work /service before submitting your offer.

2. SCOPE OF WORK:

- 2.1. The scope of work consists of hiring of 02 no. Ambulance (Model: Tata Magic Express Type B or any similar type vehicle), life of the vehicle should be less than 5-year-old ambulance. The ambulances should be single stretch premium vehicle of 2021 or later model, should be operated round the clock, on all days, for a period of 24 months from the date of commencement of the contract.
- 2.2. The ambulance should be equipped with medical aid and necessary fitments such as;
 - a) Hooks for intra-venous bottle
 - b) Bracket for oxygen cylinder with adjustable straps
 - c) Wailing horn and signaling equipment
 - d) Factory made stretcher
 - e) Medicine cabinet.
 - f) Pillow with case, Sheets, blankets and towels.
- 2.3. Emesis bag, Bed pan, urinal and glass should be arranged in the ambulance.
- 2.4. Ambulance should have a wheeled stretcher with folding and adjustable devices, with the head of the stretcher capable of being tilted upwards.
- 2.5. Vehicles should have valid and proper documents like RC Book, FC Certificate, Insurance Policy, Tax paid token, Pollution certificates, First aid medicines etc. during the contract period. All statutory conditions to be fully met by contractor at their cost. UCSL authorized officer has the right to verify RC book, FC Certificate, Insurance, Pollution Certificate and Tax paid.
- 2.6. The ambulance is supposed to be stationed at the different location of the yard as per the direction of concerned officer-in-charge of UCSL.


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- 2.7. The vehicle should report with **minimum 80%** fuel and other consumables for meeting the daily work with driver.
- 2.8. The service provider shall ensure that sufficient funds are provided to the driver / vehicle-in-charge of contractor representative/ Contractor supervisor, towards the cost of fuel and other expenses.
- 2.9. Ambulance operation should be throughout the year (24X7 service for 365 Days) including Sundays and Holidays.
- 2.10. The driver should report on duty for 12hrs per day (08:00Hrs to 20:00Hrs) at Hanagrkatte yard. in case of emergency during (20:00hrs to 08:00Hrs) the ambulance will be operated by UCSL trained personnel, if required so.
- 2.11. The Driver should report on duty for 24hrs per day at Malpe Yard and the ambulance with driver should be available (24x7 for 365 days),

- 2.12. The service provider shall be responsible for deployment of ambulance driver at the yard as stipulated in clause: 2.10, 2.11 and changing the ambulance driver too often is unacceptable. The requirement of driver for ambulance service will be decided prior to commencement of contract.
- 2.13. The Ambulance should be stationed at UCSL-Malpe & UCSL- Hangarakatte main gate inside factory at all times with full readiness and for operation in respect of fuel availability and willingness of the drivers.
- 2.14. Arrangement of alternate vehicle in the event of breakdown of vehicles that may occur during service, or rejection by USCL Officer-in-Charge, shall be done by the service provider immediately at their own cost. If the firm fails on this, UCSL reserves the right to engage vehicle from other sources and the cost so incurred shall be borne by the firm/Deducted from the monthly bill on actuals.
- 2.15. The driver/Supervisor should keep the vehicle in a hygiene condition inside and out.
- 2.16. Fan belt, Stephney, standard tools, spare bulb, fuses, hose pipe etc., to attend emergency repairs.
- 2.17. Display board with "**ON CONTRACT WITH UDUPI COCHIN SHIPYARD MALPE**" should be legibly displayed on front and back of the ambulance. Ambulances should ply only with the "Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited" name board.
- 2.18. UCSL will not take responsibility for any liabilities caused by the contractor in respect of the vehicle's tax, insurance, road permit, accident, labour laws or penalties by authorities etc., or will not compensate part or full whatever may be the reasons.
- 2.19. The driver should have minimum two-year experience of driving in similar vehicle with proof of valid license and First Aid Training Certificate.

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- 2.20. The ambulance driver should be physical fit and should not suffer from color blindness, night blindness, squint, glaucoma or cataract, their visual field and stereo depth should be within normal limits, and their visual acuity should be as follows:
- If below 35 years, - The total amount of myopia (including the cylinder) shall not exceed (-) 6.00 D in each eye. The total amount of hypermetropia (including the cylinder) shall not exceed (+) 4.00 D in each eye.
 - If above 35 years, - The total amount of myopia (including the cylinder) shall not exceed (-) 6.00 D in each eye. The total amount of hypermetropia (including the cylinder) shall not exceed (+) 6.00 D in each eye.
- 2.21. The ambulance driver that are engaged should produce a medical certificate from an ophthalmologist regarding the examination of their eyes. The report should specifically mention the eye examination pertaining to the above-mentioned diseases, and their visual acuity. Their eye examination results, as regards to the above tests should be within the normal limits.
- 2.22. The driver should undergo 6 monthly periodic medical examination by the ophthalmologist and their visual standards should be within the limits prescribed above. The report of the same should be submitted to the officer in charge every six months.
- 2.23. While on duty, the driver should be neatly dressed and should wear the prescribed uniform (white paint and white half sleeve shirts) along with the required personal protective equipment's such as safety helmet, safety shoes, reflective jacket, safety goggles, and other PPEs as applicable to the work area. This has to be done at the expense of the contractor.
- 2.24. The driver should regularly wash the uniforms and shall be presentably neat and clean while reporting for duty.
- 2.25. No person shall be allowed to continue duty beyond 16 Hrs. at a stretch. Minimum 8 Hrs. intervals shall be provided to the person in between 2 consecutive duties.
- 2.26. The driver should open and close the doors for the PATIENTS while getting into and alighting the Ambulance.
- 2.27. The driver should work in 8 Hours duty per day only.
- 2.28. Vendor's Ambulance driver will be responsible to obey traffic rules.
- 2.29. The driver should be paid as per the Government minimum wage Act.
- 2.30. Reporting officer shall have right to restrict entry of the driver in case, if the driver is habitual offender in terms of cleanliness and miss behavior.
- 2.31. The quoted rate shall include the cost for supply of vehicle in perfect running condition, Fuel, Lubricants, Spares, Statutory Payments, Repairs if any and other essential requirements.
- 2.32. The firm should ensure that there should not be any advertisement on the ambulance.



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- 2.33. Monthly requirement is 300km beyond 300km on requirement need to be undertaken by the service provider. For extra kilometers additional payment shall be made by UCSL.
- 2.34. Log sheet: The time and distance of service provided shall start from UCSL Malpe Site. Odometer reading, starting, and closing time shall be entered in log sheet based on daily basis. Time and distance reading on Garage-to-Garage basis shall not be considered for payment in any circumstances. Log sheet to be certified by UCSL officer-in-charge on daily basis.
- 2.35. The contractor/contractor's representative shall be available for contacting over phone (landline/mobile) locally 'ROUND THE CLOCK' and 'ROUND THE YEAR' basis. They shall also have E-MAIL ID for communication.
- 2.36. A dedicated mobile number shall be provided for each ambulance location (Malpe & Hangarakatte yard), and it shall remain operational round the clock.

3. SCHEDULE OF DEPLOYED OF VEHICLE:

- 3.1. Ambulance 1 (Malpe) : From 01st July 2026 to 30th June 2028.
- 3.2. Ambulance 2 (Hangarkatta) : From 11th August 2026 to 10th August 2028.

4. PERIOD OF CONTRACT:

- 4.1. The contract shall be valid for 2 years from date of issue of work order. Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited (UCSL) reserves the right to extend the validity of contract for a further 01-year period on same rate & conditions. The extension of contract will be based on the performance of the contractor. Decision of officer -in-charge, UCSL will be final in this regard. The quoted rates will remain firm without any escalation during the contract period of 02 year and for extension period of 01 year.
- 4.2. Mobilization of Ambulance shall be done within 15 days from the placement of Work Order.

5. VALIDITY:

- 5.1. The offer shall be valid for a period of 01 year and no escalation in rate shall be allowed by UCSL on whatsoever reason.

6. TAXES & DUTIES:

- 6.1. GST shall be applicable extra on the prescribed work. You are requested to furnish the following details in the invoice/Bill.
- Applicable rate of GST/SAC Code
 - Firms GST Reg. NO.
 - Service accounting code (SAC) as prescribed by statutory authorities.
 - GST Reg. No. of Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited(**29AAACT1281B1ZO**).



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7. PAYMENT:

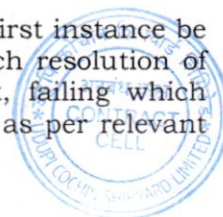
- 7.1. Payment will be made on monthly basis.
- 7.2. Payment shall be released within 30 days from date of submission of bill with the signature of executive officer
- 7.3. Payment will be made by RTGS/NEFT to the account of Agency. The name of the bank, branch, A/C No., IFSC code & other particulars shall be furnished by the Agency in the proforma of UCSL.

8. TERMINATION & LIMITATION OF LIABILITY:

- 8.1. This contract may be terminated upon the occurrence of any of the following events
 - 8.1.1. By agreement in writing of the parties hereto;
 - 8.1.2. By the non-defaulting party, upon default by the other party, of any clause of this contract, if not remedied within thirty (30) days, or such longer time as may be agreed upon by the parties, after receipt of notice thereof in writing from the non-defaulting party;
 - 8.1.3. By the other party, upon either party;
 - (i) Making the assignment for the benefit of creditors, being adjudged a bankrupt or becoming insolvent; or
 - (ii) Having a reasonable petition filed seeking its' dissolution or liquidation, not stayed or dismissed within sixty (60) days; or
 - (iii) Ceasing to do business for any reason.
 - 8.1.4. In cases where maximum limit of LD is reached and still the items are not delivered.
 - 8.1.5. For fraud and corruption or other unacceptable practices.
 - 8.1.6. Upon expiry or termination of this Contract, neither party shall be discharged from any antecedent obligations or liabilities to the other party under this Contract unless otherwise agreed in writing.
- 8.2. UCSL may by notice in writing to supplier terminate the order after issuing due notice i.e., 15 days' notice period. UCSL shall be entitled to compensation for the loss limited to the order value.
- 8.3. Liability maximum that can be claimed by the supplier shall be limited to what is due to be and has been paid by UCSL for the material delivered/work done as per the payment milestones.

9. ARBITRATION & JURISDICTION:

- 9.1. Any disputes arising during the period of the contract shall, in the first instance be settled by mutual discussions and negotiations. The results of such resolution of dispute shall be incorporated as an amendment to the contract, failing which supplier shall approach the UCSL Grievance Redressal Committee as per relevant clause of the Contract.



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- 9.2. If any dispute, disagreement, or question arising out of or relating to or in consequence of the contract, or to its fulfillment, or the validity of enforcement thereof, cannot be settled mutually or the settlement of which is not herein specifically provided for, then the dispute shall within thirty days from the date either party informs the other in writing that such disputes, disagreement exists, be referred to arbitration. The arbitrators shall be appointed and the arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with and subject to the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (No. 26 of 1996) as amended from time to time and the decision of the Arbitrators shall be final and binding on the parties hereto. The arbitration will be done by a Board comprising one arbitrator nominated by each party, and a mutually agreed Umpire. Each party shall bear its own cost of preparing and presenting its case. The cost of arbitration shall be shared equally by the parties unless the award provides otherwise. Performance under this Contract shall however, continue during arbitration proceedings and no payment due or payable by the parties hereto shall be withheld unless any such payment is or forms a part of the subject matter of arbitration proceedings.
- 9.3. Seat & Venue of Arbitration: The seat & venue of arbitration shall be at Bangalore.
- 9.4. Language of Arbitration: The Language of arbitration shall be English.
- 9.5. Governing Law: The contract shall be governed by Indian Law
- 9.6. In case of disputes, the same will be subjected to the jurisdiction of courts at Bangalore, Karnataka.

10. SUB CONTRACTING AND ASSIGNMENT

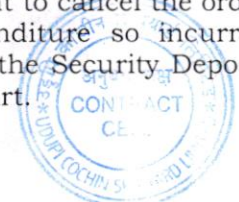
- 10.1. Contractor shall not assign or transfer the Purchase Order/ Work Order or any share or interest therein in any manner or degree to any third party without the prior written consent of UCSL
- 10.2. Contractor shall not contract with any subcontractor and/or vendor without the prior written consent of UCSL. Such consent shall not relieve the Contractor from any of his responsibilities and liabilities under the Purchase Order/ Work Order. In addition, Contractor shall ensure that the terms and conditions of any such contract shall comply with and correspond to the terms and conditions of the Purchase Order/ Work Order.

11. SECRECY & RESTRICTION ON INFORMATION TO MEDIA

- 11.1. The information contained in the enquiry as such shall NOT be communicated to any third party without prior approval of UCSL.
- 11.2. Information in respect of contracts/orders shall NOT be released to the national or international media or anyone not directly involved in its execution without the written approval of UCSL.

12. CANCELLATION OF ORDER AND RISK CONTRACTING

- 12.1. In the event the contractor fails to complete the work promptly and satisfactorily as per the terms of the order, and if the work is delayed beyond thirty (30) days from the agreed schedule, UCSL, without prejudice, reserves the right to cancel the order and get the work done at contractor's cost and the expenditure so incurred including any damage or loss will be recovered from him and the Security Deposit furnished by him is liable to be forfeited either in whole or in part.




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13. FORCE MAJEURE

13.1. Should failure in performance of any part of this contract arise from war, insurrection, restraint imposed by Government act or legislation of other statutory authority, from explosion, riot, legal lock-out, flood, fire, act of God or any inevitable or unforeseen event beyond human control which will be construed as a reasonable ground for extension of time, UCSL may allow such additional time as is mutually agreed to be justified by the circumstances of the case.

14. SAFETY OF PERSONNEL AND FIRST AID

14.1. The Agency shall be entirely responsible for the safety of all the personnel employed by him on the work. In this regard, he may adopt all the required safety measures and strictly comply with the safety regulations in force. In this regard, the Contractor will have to fully indemnify UCSL against any claims made by his workmen/other personnel.

14.2. The Agency may arrange to suitably insure all his workmen/ other personnel in this regard. UCSL will not be responsible for any injury or illness to the Contractor's workmen/other personnel during execution of the works due to whatsoever reasons.

14.3. The Agency shall provide and maintain so as to be readily accessible during all working hours, a first aid box with prescribed contents at every place where he employs contract labor for executing the works.

15. LABOUR LAWS AND REGULATIONS

15.1. The Contractor shall undertake and execute the work with contract Labor only after taking license from the appropriate authority under the Contract Labor (Regulation & Abolition) Act 1970.

15.2. The Contractor shall observe and comply with the provisions of all labour and industrial laws and enactments and shall comply with and implement the provisions of the Factories Act, 1948, Employees Provident Funds & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, Employees State Insurance Act, Payment of Gratuity Act, minimum Wages Act, Payment of Bonus Act, Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act and all other enactments as are applicable to him and his workmen employed by him. The Contractor shall inform UCSL his license number from the Central Labour Commissioner.

15.3. All contract workmen, except those exempted under the respective Acts, shall necessarily be insured under the ESI scheme and be made members of the EPF Scheme from the day of their engagement as contract workmen in the Company. In Case 1, All such insured contract workmen should carry with them their ESI Identity Card for verification by the authorities. No contract workmen without a valid ESI Identity Card for verification by the authorities will be permitted to work in the company.

15.4. The Contractor shall maintain the records viz. Muster Roll, Acquittance Roll with full details, Account books etc., in original. These are required for inspection by the concerned authorities under each scheme.

15.5. Any other amount payable under any law or in respect of any person employed by the Contractor, if not paid by him, shall be deducted, or adjusted by UCSL out of any amount payable to the Contractor including any Security Receipt and paid ever or withheld for payment by UCSL.



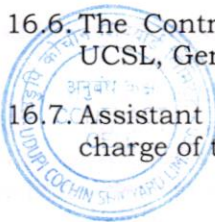

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- 15.6. The Contractor shall be fully responsible for the conduct and discipline of the workmen employed by him in the Company premises. If such workmen commit any misconduct or criminal act inside the Company, the Contractor shall take appropriate action against such workmen. The contractor shall abide by the instructions/ guidelines issued by the Company for maintenance of discipline and good conduct among the workmen employed by him.
- 15.7. Person who is engaged for works in UCSL either directly or through contractors, should produce the following documents prior to issuing their entry passes:
- 15.8. Passport/attested copy of passport with photo and address particulars.
OR
Police clearance certificate with photo and address particulars. (Police clearance certificate to the effect that the concerned person is staying in the area of jurisdiction of the certificate issuing Police Station and that the person is not involved in any criminal offences as per the records available therein.)
- 15.9. Contractors **are to familiarize themselves with the labour rules & regulations.**

16. OTHER TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 16.1. Quality of work shall conform to the specification/ standards laid down by UCSL.
- 16.2. UCSL reserves the right to accept / reject any offer.
- 16.3. Damages caused to the Shipyard properties/tools/accessories should be rectified by the Contractor at his cost or proportional recoveries will be made from the contractor while passing their bills for payment.
- 16.4. The Contractor shall indemnify UCSL or its officers against any claims arising out of accidents or injuries to workmen or other persons or damage to other property which may arise during the execution of the contract or from breach of any Law or Regulation prior to delivery and acceptance of the items at UCSL.
- 16.5. It is also to be understood by the Contractor that Udupi Cochin Shipyard Limited does not bind itself to give the Contractor any regular or specific quantity or area of work and it shall be done at the sole discretion of UCSL depending on the prevailing site conditions and other limiting factors and no claim on this account from the contractor shall be entertained.
- 16.6. The Contractor shall also be governed by the General Conditions of Contract of UCSL, General Safety Rules and other relevant Labour laws.
- 16.7. Assistant General Manager or his authorized representative will be the Officer-in-charge of this Contract.
