FROM THE CMD'S DESK



My dear colleagues,

It is my pleasure to extend greetings to the readers of the 16th issue of the House Magazine, Coshya Digest. This house magazine by its format is limited in the amount of information it can provide, but I am happy that the team is making every effort to presentthe latest achievements and events in the yard to the CSL family and our stakeholders.

We welcome Shri Mansukh Lal Mandaviya, as the new Minister of State for Shipping (Independent charge). He has been our Minister of State, in the previous government and is well aware of the challenges and opportunities in this sector. I have recently had the opportunity to interact with the Hon. Minister and have welcomed him to visit CSL at his earliest convenience, which he has graciously accepted.

The first quarter of the financial year 2019-20 has seen CSL making steady growth - both in Shipbuilding and Ship Repair. I have to however caution that we need to do more to reach the

ambitious targets we have committed.

It was during this period that we signed contract with the Indian Navy for construction of eight (08) Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Crafts (ASWSWCs). CSL was the successful bidder (L1) in the tender floated by the Ministry of Defence for this prestigious project.

We designed, built and delivered five fishing vessels to the owners, as of now and eleven more such vessels are in the pipeline to be delivered. The feedback being received is very encouraging. We are sure, this being a project for the benefit of the fishermen community, will change the lives of that community as also open new business avenues for CSL.

We are stabilizing our operations in our CSL Mumbai Ship Repair Unit (CMSRU) where we have completed 16 docking/ undocking of various types of vessels. We expect to start repairs in CSL Kolkata Ship Repair Unit (CKSRU) shortly. Civil works at HCSL, our subsidiary in Kolkata, is gaining momentum and is proceeding as per plan.

The Long Term settlement (LTS) with the Trade Unions have been signed after due approvals from the Ministry, and the new pay structure has come into force. I believe that concluding the LTS in a cordial manner after very intense and long drawn discussions is very significant for CSL and is reflective of our positive culture. Certain matters outside the purview of the LTS that came up during the discussions are also being addressed after due consultations.

We have a lot to be done on both the shipbuilding and shiprepair fronts. Significant efforts are needed on the IAC where many milestones are to be clocked for us to meet targets of GT starting, Basin trials and Sea trials. The TDV, 500 and 1200 PAX vessels, IWAI vessels, Ambulance boats, Brows and Pontoons etc. need to be 'held tight' to meet deadlines and protect our reputation. Shiprepair activities are to be extremely focused - to live up to the expectations of our clients and meet our financial targets.

I am sure we will all work together as 'Team CSL', iron out any differences in the most cordial manner - as we have always done, and continue to keep our flag flying high.







Company is providing electronic voting (remote e-



RO PAX VESSELS FOR IWAI

CSL ventured into the Inland Ferry Sector in 2017 with the construction of 2 Nos. Ro-Ro Ferries for Kochi Municipal Corporation, lending support to the corporation's commitment to resolve the transportation crisis faced by Kochi. The innovative "Floating Bridges" were well suited to meet the requirement of cross channel ferrying of vehicles and passengers between Fort Kochi and Vypin. Gaining impetus from the success of this project and riding on the back of the government's flagship "Sagar Mala Project", IWAI (Inland Waterways Authority of India) nominated CSL for the construction of 8 Nos. Ro-Pax ferries for operation in strategic locations in National Waterways 1 and 2.

A team from CSL team along with officials from IWAI visited the terminal sites along National Waterways-II where the new vessels are intended to be put into operation with the objective of understanding the operational and design requirements of the new vessels. The team visited the terminals at Hathsingimari, Kamlabari, Neamati, Sengajan & Maijan.

Ferry services are the principal means of transportation in these areasas there are only few bridges built across Brahmaputra, and on top of thissome parts of Brahmaputra exceed 30 km in width. Ferries currently plying in this area are overcrowded and donot having proper safety

arrangements. Further many traditional ferries with temporary ramps made of wood were also observed during the visit. Therefore, modern Ro-Pax vessels with a large passengercapacity is imperative to meet the transportation needs of the area.

During the visit, discussions were held with the crew of the existing vessel to fathom the difficulties faced during operations of the existing vessels and to gain insight into the operational requirements for the vessels including draft/air draft limitations, requirements for ramp design and capability to operate in heavy water current, vehicle/passenger volume, mooring and anchoring requirements etc.

Low fuel consumption was a requirement put forward by IWAI to ensure viability of the ferry service. A low resistance hull form with flared bow suitable for the low draft was developed in-house. Model testing of the vessel was done in IIT Kharagpurto decide the engine power.

A major problem which IWAI faced with the existing vessels was damage topropeller/shaft due to entanglement of debris like ropes and nets which often results in disruption of regular ferry services.

This may require a diver to clean the propeller and at times necessitate dry docking of the vessel for which the vessel needs to be taken all the way from Assam to Kolkata through Bangladesh. The downtime in such a case is huge. CSL designed the new vessels with two Deck Mounted propulsion units which offers distinct advantages over conventional propulsion systems;

- Repair -In the deck mounted thruster configuration the vertical drive stem can be tilted for cleaning and maintenance.
- Installation Fully self-contained outboard propulsion units with a diesel engine placed in a canopy and mounted directly on the deck. Simple plug and play installation with no requirements for ventilation system, seals or
- Design No separate engine room space is 0 required inside the hull - ensures low vibration levels, no ER ventilation / firefighting systems requirements.
- Maneuverability Continuous 360-degree steering providing excellent maneuverability even at very low speeds. This is particularly useful in case of meandering and highly congested waterways.



The basic design and detailed engineering of the Brows and Pontoon are done by our own in-house design team.





6[™] AND 7[™] TUNA LONG LINER CUM GILLNET FISHING VESSEL



The Sixth and Seventh Tuna Long Liner Cum Gillnetter Fishing Vessels of the series of 16 vessels were launched on 04 June 2019 and 14 June respectively.

Smt A Sobha of CSL did the honours for vessel No. FV-06 Smt K Madhavi did the honours for the vessel FV-07. Both Smt Sobha and Smt Madhavi are the seniormost women employees of CSL at that time.

Cochin Shipyard is building a total of 16 Nos. Tuna Long Lining and Gillnetting fishing vessels under the diversification scheme of trawling fishing boats into deep sea fishing boats under Govt. of India Blue Revolution scheme with financial assistance from Government of India and Government of Tamilnadu. These vessels are designed and built as 'state of the art' high quality fishing vessels with modern navigation and communication equipment and advanced net hauling and liner winches. Other facilities include galleys, bio-toilet, refrigerated

seawater system and stainless steel cladded PUF insulated Fish Hold to preserve the fish catch. These boats are a great boon to Indian Fishing Community to migrate to more sustainable Deep Sea Fishing.

Cochin Shipyard Limited signed contract for construction and supply of eight (08) Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Crafts (ASWSWCs) for Indian Navy. CSL was the successful bidder (L1) in the tender floated by the Ministry of Defence for this project.

Shri Rajesh Gopalakrishnan, GM (Business Development) exchanged the contract with Shri Ravi Kant, Joint Secretary / AM (MS), Ministry of Defence, Government of India in a function held in Delhi on 30 April 2019.

The order value for these eight (08) vessels is pegged at ₹6,311.32 Crore. The first ship is to be delivered within 42 months from contract signing date and subsequent balance ships delivery schedule will be two (02) ships per year. The project will have to be completed within 84 months from date of signing the contract.

These Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Crafts (ASWSWCs) are designed for a deep displacement of about 750 tonne, speed of 25 knots and complement of 57 and capable of full scale sub surface surveillance of coastal waters and co-ordinated ASW for search and rescue by day and night in coastal areas. In their secondary role, they will be capable to prosecute intruding aircraft, and lay mines in the sea bed.

The vessels will be equipped with highly advanced state-of-the-art integrated platform management systems including propulsion machinery, auxiliary machinery, power generation and distribution machinery and damage control machinery etc. The ASWSWC Corvette's are also being built Class standards, in addition to the owner specific requirements.

The ASWSWC contracts augur well for CSL into the future. CSL is currently investing a total of ₹ 2,769 Crore in building a new 310 M long dry dock at Kochi and a shiplift based Ship Repair yard at Willingdon Island, Kochi.



Introduction

Sixteen projects have been successfully completed by Ship Repair during first quarter of financial year 2019-20.

Projects at CSL Main Facility.

Short refit of INS Tir, cadet training vessel of Indian Navy, has been completed on 15 May 2019. Refit of INS Jyoti which is an oil tanker is nearing completion. Diving support vessel of Indian Navy INS Nireekshak and Survey vessel INS Sarvekshak have arrived at yard for refits on 23 June 2019 & 24 June 2019. Another Naval vessel INS Sharda is scheduled for commencement of Normal Refit during first week of July 2019.

Other vessels undergoing repairs are High Speed crafts of M/s LDCL HSC Parali, Valiyapani & Cheriyapani & Passenger vessel of Andaman & Nicobar administration MV Nancowry.

Vessels repaired during April to June 2019 include Naval Ship INS Tir, MODU Sagar Vijay - Mobile Offshore Drilling Unit of of M/s ONGC, SPM3 of M/s Sikka Ports & Terminals Ltd., Research vessel RV Sindhu Sadhana of M/s National Institute of Oceanography, MV Sagar Samraj and MV Lakshadweep Sea - passanger vessels of M/s LDCL, Tug Vallarpadam of Cochin Port Trust, DCI Dredge XXI of M/s Dredging Corporation of India and MV Shanthi Sagar XIII of M/s Adani Ports.

competition from other yards against a global tender. The major scope of work comprised of replacement of all four Main Engines along with new control systems. Other major works include overhauling & testing of Drill String Motion Compensator, Accumulator for DSMC, cylinders of BOP, LMRP Spider Beam, overhauling of 90 Nos.



motors, up gradation of finger board system for pipe racking, renewal of anchor winch control system, up gradation of ballast control system, renewal of skidding track for BOP, painting of Derrick etc. The quoted period of 80 days was really challenging for the above scope of work. However with the excellent support and co-ordination among CSL, ONGC & SCI all the repairs including 68 nos of growth of work and 10 AWRF jobs were completed within 81 days and the vessel sailed off on the 82nd day i.e., 12th Apr 2019. This has turned out to be a landmark project both for CSL and ONGC. ONGC has appreciated CSL at the highest level for the timely completion of the project with no cost overrun.

Extended Short Refit of INS Tir

INS Tir, the first dedicated cadet's training vessel under the ownership of Indian Navy, successfully completed her Extended Short Refit within 120 days as per contractual obligations on 15 May 19. She is the senior ship of first training squadron of the Southern Naval Command (SNC) which has a LOA of 106.66 m, Moulded Breadth of 13.20 m and displacement of 2577 Tons. INS Tir is one of the vessels from SNC that has been regularly dry docked at CSL Main facility. The refit commenced on 14 Jan 19 and completed within the scheduled repair duration of 120 days overcoming the major hurdles to complete all critical underwater jobs viz. Shafting,

renewal of thordon bushes, renewal of shaft seals, repairs on steering gear system & rudder, surface preparation and painting of eight underwater compartments which were raised as additional works during the dry dock period. The major repair works were Fatigue life assessment test by IRS, inclination test, renewal of 100 Tons steel, major routines on sewage treatment plant and vacuum toilet system, surface preparation and painting of machinery bilges and tanks, modular accommodation jobs, inspection of main engine coolers, Plummer block (Port & Stbd), Diesel driven

High Pressure Air Compressors, overhauling of diesel alternators, overhauling of oily water separator and other electrical, electronics, communication and navigational equipments. Repair works were completed as a result of seamless team effort and vessel finally sailed off from CSL on 15 May 19.

RV Sindhu Sadhana

RV Sindhu Sadhana, a research vessel, owned by National Institute of Oceanography (NIO), sailed off post completion of her first five year dry docking survey & allied repairs on 07 May 2019. Major scope of work in the vessel involves complete overhauling of Main Diesel Generators, Azimuth as well as Bow Thrusters, Variable Frequency Drives (VFD), Compressors and auxiliary machineries. Overhauling and Load testing of deck machineries

including Hydraulic windlass, Boat davits & Knuckle Cranes. Surface Preparation and Paint scheme renewal of hull exterior with Gondola, that was fitted underneath of vessel for housing sensors for research purpose & internal compartments were also completed during the repairs

SPM Buoy 03

It's been three years since we were continuously repairing Single Point Mooring Buoys (SPM) for Reliance Industries Limited. SPMs are used as mooring points at outer sea for mother ships/VLCCs. where they deliver crude oil or receive refined products from the refinery. Thus it facilitates vessels with more draft to deliver the crude / receive the refined products without entering the shallow waters. The single point mooring buoy consists of a buoy that is permanently moored to the seabed by means of multiple mooring lines. The buoy contains a bearing system that allows a part of it to rotate around the moored geostatic part. When moored to this rotating part of the buoy with a mooring connection, the vessel is able to freely move around the geostatic part of the buoy.

SPM-03 was the third buoy in this series. It arrived for repairs at CSL on 12 February 2019 and sailed after completion of work on 25 April 2019. We were successful in delivering all the SPMs on time. The main jobs done on SPM-03 are hull renewals, fender renewal, surface preparation and painting of voids and tanks, overhauling of various arms, machining of flanges and line boring etc.

COCHIN SHIPYARD MUMBAI SHIP REPAIR UNIT (CMSRU)

CSL commenced Ship Repair activities at CMSRU on 18 January 2019. A total of Tten (10) projects have been successfully completed at CMSRU as on 30 June 2019. Ship Repair Operations in Mumbai will give us a strong base on the west coast and also help us to tap business potentials of major vessel owners operating in and around Mumbai and the high valued projects of Western Naval Command.



INS Delhi, a weapon platform of Indian Navy has been refitted at CMSRU in March - April 2019. INS Vela a Submarine built by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd was docked and launching of the vessel has been done inside Hughes Dry Dock at CMSRU in May 2019.

Other vessels repaired at our Mumbai Ship Repair facility include Offshore Supply vessels MV Shrikant and MV Shridhar of M/s Asianol Shipping Limited, M V Albatross - 5 of M/s Albatross Marine Services, Tugs HT Ajay & HT Ajinkya of M/s Mumbai Port Trust, DSV Samudra Prabha of M/s Shipping Corporation of India, ICGS Samudra Prahari of Indian Coast Guard and offshore supply vessel Great Ship Asmi of Great ship India Limited. M V Hal Anant offshore supply vessel of M/s Hal offshore limited is currently undergoing repair at Hughes drydock of CMSRU. The vessel is scheduled to be undocked during first week of July 2019.

SCI Nalanda has arrived for repairs on 25 June 2019. The main work on the vessel is replacement of boat davit. The vessel will be docked during first week of July 2019 for carrying out under water works.

ISRF

Five vessels have been undergone repairs at ISRF during Apr-Jun 2019. MV Skipper II a training vessel of CIFNET Chennai has arrived at ISRF on 02 Apr



2019 for major drydock repairs. Major works on CPP ,Hull and painting completed. Other repair activities are nearing completion and the vessel is expected to sail off by end of July 2019.

SHIPREPAIR

LDCL vessel Tug Kiltan arrived at ISRF on 25 May 2019 and completed its underwater repairs on 21 Jun 2019. Afloat repairs on Tug Kiltan are progressing as per schedule. The vessel is scheduled for delivery by Mid July 2019.

Three High Speed Crafts of LDCL viz HSC Blue Marlin, HSC Black Marlin and HSC Skip Jack have arrived at ISRF on 25 Jun 2019 for Monsoon Repairs. HSC Blue Marlin has directly taken in dock for underwater repairs and other two at L-Jetty are undergoing afloat repairs.

KMA has instituted these awards to encourage awareness, knowledge creation, engagement and bring recognition to dedicated corporate houses in the field of CSR.










CONTAINER PUBLIC TOILET

Our long voyage in the Indian Navy's warship came to an halt at Mangalapuram. We had a few days available on the shore as the ship stayed there for a short period.

We were two, me and my friend Lt Avinash Sharma, young officers who had nothing much to do in that small coastal town.

We had become friends over these last few

months of working together and knew each other very well. Avinash hailing from Varanasi is the son of a priest in one of the temples there.

The Navy has provided us opportunities to see the world and within that short stint in service, we have seen most of the important port towns in the world. Compared to those, Mangalapuram had nothing to offer. Still we decided to explore the places in and around that town, on foot and by using public transport.

We, both being foodies, our first adventure was to try the restaurants including the roadside eateries



in and around Mangalapuram. We have already heard that Mangalapuram is famous for its delicacies.

During one of those explorations, we landed up in Udupi, where the famous temple of Lord Krishna is situated. This holy shrine also caters to thousands of devotees every day. That was the only knowledge we had about the place. By the time we landed up at the gate we were in a confused state of mind whether to visit the temple or to go straight away to the dining to have some food and return.

"Arre yaar, bhagwaan kaa darshan kiye bina unkaa prasaad khaana theek hai kya?" (Is it proper to eat the offerings to the God, without having His darshan?).. Avinash being the son of a priest probably felt guilty for having had ignored the I being a South Indian knew the rituals there. He must be around seven to eight year old, dark in colour with a shaven head, leaving some hair behind and sandalwood paste applied on his forehead.

We have no proper dress, we conveyed our helplessness. "Dont worry Sir, I will arrange everything for you". He took us quickly to a place where we were provided white dhoties and angavasthrams (cloth to cover the upper body). We quickly changed to that new attire and left all our belongings in the locker provided to us.

We struggled to locate the boy in the crowd. "Hey, what's your name?". I asked. "I am Gopal"...

he shouted back while making way for us to reach the sanctum sanctorum through the crowd.

"Sir, look through the window" the boy directed us. The deity is worshipped through a silver plated window with nine holes. The sight of the deity made Avinash and me spell bound. It was Krishna having his flute in his hand beside a cow. "Govinda, Gopala,, save us.. " I could hear the murmuring of Avinash.

It was time to leave. We proceeded towards the locker counter to change and collect our belongings. After settling the bill there, we searched for Gopal. We must give him some tips. Where is he?

He was nowhere to be seen. I ran to the temple and checked with the people working at the locker section. "Have you seen the boy who came with us and helped us.. ? His name is Gopal". "We don't know Sir, we haven't seen anyone."

From there we proceeded to dining and had our food. Our eyes searched for Gopal in the crowd among the people who served food, washed plates and everywhere but in vain.

We returned to the ship in the afternoon and couple of days later we sailed off to another distant land.

Now I am retired. Occasionally I visit the temple with my family. And I am still in search of Gopal.

Avinash has taken over the profession of his father and become a full time priest in a temple and he claims to be seeing Gopal every day in his deity.
